








Vaccination of SF Residents






Vaccination administration 6,800/day rolling average

- Pfizer EUA for 12-15 year olds could be granted early next week (~25,000 potential vacinees)


Vaccinations by Race/Ethnicity






Vaccine administration by all providers by race/ethnicity

Vaccine administration by SFDPH by race/ethnicity




CDC Masking Guidance



NEW MASK GUIDELINES

The Center for Disease Control updated their mask guidelines based on whether the person has been vaccinated or not. Here are its recommendations for some outdoor and indoor activities:





Yellow Tier Reopening (below list is not exhaustive)

Industry	Limitations
Indoor dining	 50% capacity No limit on # of households/8 people per table 6 feet minimum distance between tables TV and live entertainment (following safety rules) is allowed Face coverings to be removed only when eating/drinking Self-service buffets allowed with monitoring and cleaning
Outdoor dining and outdoor bars	 No limit on # of households/8 people per table Tables generally spaced at least 6 feet apart Group reservations for up to 25 people allowed Face coverings may stay removed at all times, unless tables are less than 6 feet apart
Indoor bars and wineries/breweries	 25% capacity or up to 100 people, if not serving meals 50% capacity, if serving meals
Entertainment venues: outdoors	- 67% capacity (increased from 50%)
Entertainment venues: indoors	- 50% capacity (increased from 35%)
Outdoor arts, music and theater festivals	- 100 patrons (increased from 50)
Indoor libraries	- 50% capacity
Movie theaters	 50% capacity or up to 500 people Concessions allowed if: 1) groups of no more than 8 people total; 2) there is service to patrons in their seats; 3) at least one ventilation measure has been implemented; 4) there is a safety monitor
Hotels and lodgings	 Limited-size private meetings are allowed per capacity limits Indoor gyms up to 50% capacity and saunas/steam rooms/hot tubs at 25% capacity
Non-essential offices	- 50% capacity (increased from 25%). Fully vaccinated workers do not count toward capacity limit
Outdoor gatherings	- 75 people, without face covering requirement
Indoor gatherings	- 50 people (increased from 25)
