Health at Home’s function within the SFHN is to provide intermittent skilled nursing, physical rehabilitation, medical social work and supportive personal care to SFHN patients who are often medically complex and confined to home. In early 2021, Health at Home staff recognized that the hardship of leaving the home was a factor in patient access to COVID-19 vaccines, and they were also those considered to be high risk for contracting COVID-19. This exposed a large vaccination access gap for the entire homebound demographic within the SFHN. With assistance from Primary Care clinics, Health at Home Administrative Leadership, and the SFHN Covid Vax team, support was provided to allow for this team of dedicated staff to offer this extremely valuable service to our community’s most fragile residents and their care givers and loved ones. Since 2/22/2021 and ongoing, Health at Home has administered 476 COVID-19 vaccines, at a rate of 6-12/day, depending on number of vaccines provided in each home and proximity of households to each other. Each member of this team went above and beyond to break down barriers and provide this service to all that were agreeable to receiving this service. Without this dedicated and caring team effort, many of our communities most vulnerable would not have had access to the vaccine.
