



Data through 11/1


New cases by vaccination status

Cumulative COVID Cases and Deaths: SF








Reproductive Rate Still Under 1.0

Rt as of 2021–10–16 = 0.81



*For race/ethnicity groups with smaller populations, population size estimates may not be precise. If the true population is larger than the estimate we use here, then the true vaccination rate will be lower than reported above. Because of this uncertainty, we only report vaccinations rates up to 90%



Schools Data

As of 10/25

SFUSD:

- ~52,000 students and ~10,000 staff
- Cumulative student AND staff cases since August 16: 451

Private, Parochial, Charter Schools:

- ~22,500 students and ~5,000 staff
- Cumulative student AND staff cases since August 16: 166

In-school transmissions and outbreaks (for all SF schools):

- In-school transmissions: 30
- Outbreaks: 9
- All cases were either mild to moderate illness and none of these required hospitalization. A maximum of 6 cases or less of students and staff were involved in each school outbreak.
