**8. SFMTA BAC Staffing Reframe** (*Presentation*) Christopher Kidd, SFMTA, will bring a proposal to reorganize SMFTA staffing to the BAC and a proposal to institute a rolling 6-month advance calendar for the BAC agenda.

**9. SFMTA Active Communities Plan** (*Presentation*) Christopher Kidd, SFMTA, will present on the SFMTA Active Communities Plan (ACP). The ACP is the first comprehensive citywide update to the Bicycle Master Plan since the 2005-2009 Bike Plan. The ACP will run from January 2022 to March 2024.

- Lots of progress have been made since 2009, but many challenges remain, such as
  - mode shift (bicycling is down), yet we still need to support the SF climate action plan
  - Vision zero: fatalities rising, after initially falling in 2013
  - Neighborhood disparities: want to implement projects and programs in equity communities, want to work with the community
  - Want to broaden the tent: leverage newer mobility technology (scooters, ebikes, etc), can be a key to unlocking the above re mode shift and can be more inclusive of different abilities and disparities
