

Richard Rosenthal is a former Los Angeles County public corruption prosecutor who has created police oversight agencies in Portland, Oregon (2001), Denver, Colorado (2005) and British Columbia, Canada (2012).

Rosenthal received his PhD in Criminology from Simon Fraser University (Burnaby, BC) in 2021, with an emphasis on civilian oversight of the police; his PhD dissertation evaluated the implementation of the federal Consent Decree in Seattle, Washington. In 2019, Dr. Rosenthal published the first academic article describing the Independent Critical Incident Investigation Agency form of civilian oversight on a global basis.

Dr. Rosenthal is currently a member of the Cleveland Consent Decree Monitoring Team working on police accountability mechanisms; is the principal consultant for the Washington State Office of Independent Investigations (which will be the first civilian-based agency to conduct criminal investigations of police uses of deadly force in the United States); and is currently serving as the Independent Police Auditor for the City of Pasadena, California.

In his spare time, Dr. Rosenthal operates a hobby farm outside of Vancouver, British Columbia and has recently retired from being a paid-on-call firefighter and apparatus operator.
