I originally am from Maine, I became homeless at 16 because my parents could not provide a safe place for me to live. Regardless of my circumstances, I made the best of it and was a 3 sport athlete, graduated national honor society, top of my class. I was able to land a scholarship to Mount Holyoke College and played Lacrosse, captained the team for 2 years. It changed my life and opened a whole new world for me. After graduating I worked at Smith College, Engineering Department. I realized that I needed to feel more alive in my day to day life so I quite my job and moved to SF over six years ago. I started bartending to support my art and gain clients, since 2018 I have now been doing art full time. I would like the opportunity to become an art vendor in SF to open my platform and expand my business in the community. Thank you for the opportunity.

All of my boards are made by hand using maple wood veneers. I bend the wood using an air bag technique over a foam mold pad. All of my shapes are original. My artwork is original, using oil paint, resin, and alcohol ink.

I took art classes in college and I learned from my grandpa. I come from a long line of woodworkers and builders.

3. Did you take a class or learn on your own?

I took classes in college and I also took classes from famous artists like Natalia Fabia. I learned how to make guitars from Sully Guitars. I learned how to finish and polish from the lead finisher at Fender Guitars.
