1	Post all active policies to the SFPD website for increased transparency and building of trust with the community		Per Ca Penal Code § 13650, SFPD must post on its website all current standards polices and operating procedures that would otherwise be made available during a PRA. The department is reviewing all documents that apply, redacting if necessary and will publicly post the current standards, where applicable. The Policy Development Division (PDD) is working with the Risk Management Office & Legal (RMO) to review and is defining the implementation work plan.	
2	DGO 6.10 Missing Persons: Expand exigent circumstances warranting immediate search	requires further discussion	This recommendations currently under review by the Deputy Chief overseeing DGO 6.10. This DGO's development has recently transitioned from the guidelines under the former DGO 3.01(issued in 2019) to the current DGO 3.01 (issued in 2022). As such, the development timelines must be recalibrated to comply with current policy. As this recommendation was captured in a DPA recommendation grid, the DC is required to respond and finalize the revised draft of the DGO. The draft DGO will then be posted publicly to capture additional recommendations from the public. This recommendation will remain open until discussed during Simultaneous Concurrence which occurs after the public posting period.

3	DGO 10.11 Body Worn Camera(BWC): Require all armed SFPD members, including command staff, to wear and activate BWC when doing police work in the community including responding to critical incidents.		The draft DGO 10.11 has not reached the point in development where command staff members or the Chief have reviewed (Simultaneous Concurrence) in order to make this determination. Commanders, Deputy Chiefs, Assistant Chiefs and the Chief are not in the Police Officers Union(POA). This new requirement would trigger a meet and confer with a separate bargaining unit where the requirement could be determined during the meet and confer process. While the department has not taken a defined position on this recommendation, command staff members rarely, if ever, encounter a mandatory recording circumstance given the scope of their job duties.
4	DPA requests to be granted access to the same body worn camera viewing platform that SFPD uses (Evidence.com) to facilitate DPA's timely investigation of officer-involved shootings and public complaints of police misconduct	requires further discussion	DPA is not a law enforcement agency and, therefore, is not entitled to access CLETS and CORI data pursuant to state law. Many of the files on Evidence.com contain this data. The California Department of Justice has advised SFPD that no state authority permits DPA to access this information. Therefore, SFPD can only meet its obligations to provide records to DPA and to protect CLETS/CORI data, by redacting any CLETS/CORI data prior to releasing it to DPA. SFPD believes it is possible for the DPA to pay for a license to have limited access to Evidence.com, wherein they could directly access only those files authorized by SFPD personnel. SFPD will look into the licensing costs, contracting implications and process associated with allowing DPA to have limited access but cannot agree to full unfettered access to search, pull, and share BWC footage from Evidence.com.

The staffing of a particular SFPD unit, bureau or division is not determined by a DGO, but instead determined by budget availability, deployment needs, crime trends and the current staffing shortage crisis. Specific staffing mandates are not feasible as the number, rank and abilities are not static features and must remain flexible for law enforcement agencies. General Orders are separate and apart from Personnel Orders.
6	DPA recommends that SFPD and DPA form a working group with SFPD's IT Division, experts on traffic stop data, and academic partners to ensure SFPD's systems are up to date and that SFPD's traffic stop data is accurate and can be validated.	requires further discussion	The Department has already expressed being open to discussing this recommendation. Demands on staffing resources, budgeting, defined criteria and clarified stated goals must be determined before entering into this endeavor.
