The Subcommittee discussed requesting information from HSH about training.

Member Comment: Chair Street wanted to make sure the data would be by site. It will be helpful to see whether there are gaps and also best practices, e.g., how harm reduction is handled. Member Creech expressed the concern that shelters have a great deal of discretion, and unfortunately some training is largely performative rather than substantive. It takes a special kind of motivation to serve the underhoused well. There are many training challenges, even, lately, fraternization with clients. Wealthy CBOs are better prepared and able to train their staff. Public Comment: Azeen expressed the view that sites need to have intake and exit coordinators. Resources need to be directed to the most needy. CBOs may not have resources and then HSH needs to step up.

**Public Comment:** Azeen says well-intentioned staff are frustrated that grievances "disappear." They may be unaware of the SMC as an avenue clients can follow, to empower them. Azeen also wonders if all shelters have security staff and is concerned that safety liaisons (acting security staff) are often not trained. Often, "ambassadors" double as security staff. It is important to have staff who are authorized to "put hands on" any "troublemaker" i.e., one who will otherwise be a danger to themselves or others. Certification is important. "Guard cards" are not hard to obtain, i.e., the amount of training for certification is not a lot. "Food handler Cards" are also worth getting. Staff need to know how to store, heat, and distribute food.
