- SAN FRANCISCO RECREATION AND PARKS PLANS TO INSTALL A POWDER-COATED ALUMINUM PERIMETER FENCE AND ENTRY GATE ALONG 11TH STREET, WHICH PROVIDES AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE INTEGRATION OF A PERMANENT PUBLIC ARTWORK.
- THE BUDGET FOR ARTWORK IS \$25,000, INCLUSIVE OF ALL ARTIST'S FEES, AS WELL AS ASSOCIATED EXPENSES FOR DESIGN AND CONSULTATION DURING FABRICATION AND INSTALLATION.

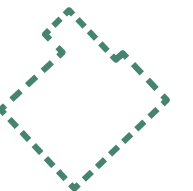

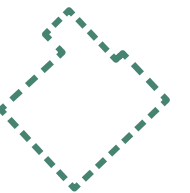

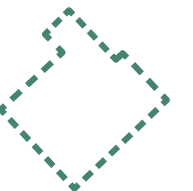
