
Design with Extensions





Concept Explanation:

The Final Art can be extended to fit the entirety of the walls, rather than just the pre-decided rectangular area. The extensions in these mock ups expand the area by ten feet on each side, not knowing exactly how much room there is to work with. The idea is that the figure's arms would extend to the ground and be visable from the lobby bar and gym areas while inside as well. None of the clouds or other elements would be cut off either.












for Artwork Placed Upon PRIVATE PROPERTY under VARA and CAPA

The artist, CASEY GRAY, has designed a work of visual art ("the Artwork") as described below. The Artwork will be located at the address below, with consent from OSIB 72 Ellis Street Properties LLC (hereinafter referred to as the "Property Owner").

Hand painted mural with art work featuring a variety of stylized hands engaging with some of the iconic sights the city is known for.

As a condition of the Property Owner's approval and authorization to create the Artwork on the Property, Artist agrees to waive and does hereby waive voluntarily all rights to attribution and integrity with respect to the Artwork and any and all claims as may arise under the Visual Artists Rights Act of 1990, 17 U.S.C. §§106A and 113(d) ("VARA"), the California Art Preservation Act (Cal. Civ. Code §§987 and 989)("CAPA"), or any other local, state, foreign or international law, as currently drafted or as may be hereafter amended, that conveys the same or similar rights (collectively "Moral Rights Laws"), with respect to the Artwork, its display, removal from display, exhibition, installation, conservation, storage, study, alteration and any other activities conducted by the Property Owner or any future owner of the Property. If the Artwork is incorporated into a building such that the Artwork cannot be removed from the building without physical defacement, mutilation, alternation, distortion, destruction, or other modification (collectively, "Modification") of the Artwork, Artist waives any and all such claims under any Moral Rights Laws arising out of or against any current or future owners of the Property, and its agents, officers and employees, for Modification of the Artwork.

The Property Owner, or any future owner of the Property, has the absolute right to change, modify, destroy, remove, relocate, move, replace, transport, repair or restore the Artwork, in whole or in part without prior notice to the Artist. However, if the Property Owner, or any future owner of the Property, modifies the Artwork without the Artist's consent in a manner that is prejudicial to Artist's reputation, Artist retains the right to disclaim authorship of the Artwork in accordance with 17 U.S.C. § 106A (a) (2).

The Property Owner has no obligation to pursue claims against third parties for modifications or damage to the Artwork done without the Property Owner's authorization. However, the Property Owner may pursue claims against third parties for modifications or damage or to restore the Artwork if the Artwork has been modified without the Property Owner's or Artist's authorization. In the event that the Property Owner pursues such a claim, Property Owner shall notify the Artist, and Artist shall cooperate with the Property Owner's efforts to prosecute such claims.

Artist bears the sole responsibility for providing the San Francisco Arts Commission and Property Owner with any changes to the Artist's Address for Notice. citizenM San Francisco (Ellis Street) Art Mural Request

Means and Methods

- citizenM has contracted out Aramark as General Contractor
- Aramark will work with local Swing Stage Company, Performance Swing Stage Company
- Performance Swing Stage Company will install a swing stage, a platform stage that is suspended from the
 top of the building. The platform either ropes or cables connected to stirrups located at each end of it. This
 will be used to transport workers, their tools and materials at an appropriate height to perform the painting.
 - Method of swing stage install: parapet clamps on (6 of them) off the parking garage with about a foot of clearance needed
 - The platform will be constructed in the terrace area and connected to the cables that are secured to the parapet clamps.
 - Protection After Hours: swing stage will be placed lower towards the ground so no one can access after hours
- Performance Swing Stage will need access to the Laz parking garage roof to set up the swing stage.
- Access:
 - Day 1: Performance Swing Stage will need access to the 3 closest parking spots for their truck and equipment. citizenM can cover the cost of any potential revenue loss for this 1 day.
 - Day 14: Performance Swing Stage will need access to the 3 closest parking spots for their truck and equipment. citizenM can cover the cost of any potential revenue loss for this 1 day.
- Timeframe: Swing stage will be up for 2 weeks, workers will be painting 7am-7pm, 7 days a week
- Paint type: Sherwin Williams A100 for the most parts and small amounts of Montana 94 spray paint for the gradients parts of the design. No primer is required.
- <u>Maintenance:</u> Required future maintenance, if any, will be performed in accordance with the terms of the Revocable permit to Enter and Use Property for the Garage
