



# Weekly Activity Report: San Francisco Department of Police Accountability

## Highlights for July 9, 2024

The following report includes the Department of Police Accountability's recent developments:

- ◆ DPA's Investigations Division has substantially reduced our cases pending over 270 days to one non-tolling case.
- ◆ DPA's Audit Division is preparing for peer review coordinated by the Association of Local Government Auditors.
- ◆ DPA conducted outreach at several Pride events and the SFPD Hill Bomb Town Hall over the past month.

## Investigation Updates

- ◆ **Cases Opened/Closed:** Our office opened 73 new cases and closed 85 cases since the last Commission meeting.
- ◆ **Cases Pending:** We've reduced cases pending by 7% since the last update.
- ◆ **Cases Sustained:** We have sustained 4 new cases since the last Commission meeting.
- ◆ **Cases Past 270-days:** We reduced our cases above the 270-day deadline by 2. This is our fourth consecutive update with a reduction.

The DPA has 20 cases open for more than 270 days. Of those, 19 cases (95%) are “tolled”.

- ◆ **Audit:** DPA’s audit of SFPD’s processes on stop data is ongoing. Our goal is to complete fieldwork testing on the stop data audit by the end of July.
- ◆ **Investigations:** DPA’s Investigators and Attorneys attended an SFPD led training on DGO 5.20 (Language Access Services for Limited English Proficient Persons).
- ◆ **Policy:** DPA completed a comprehensive review of SFPD’s Draft DGO 6.10 (Missing Persons).
