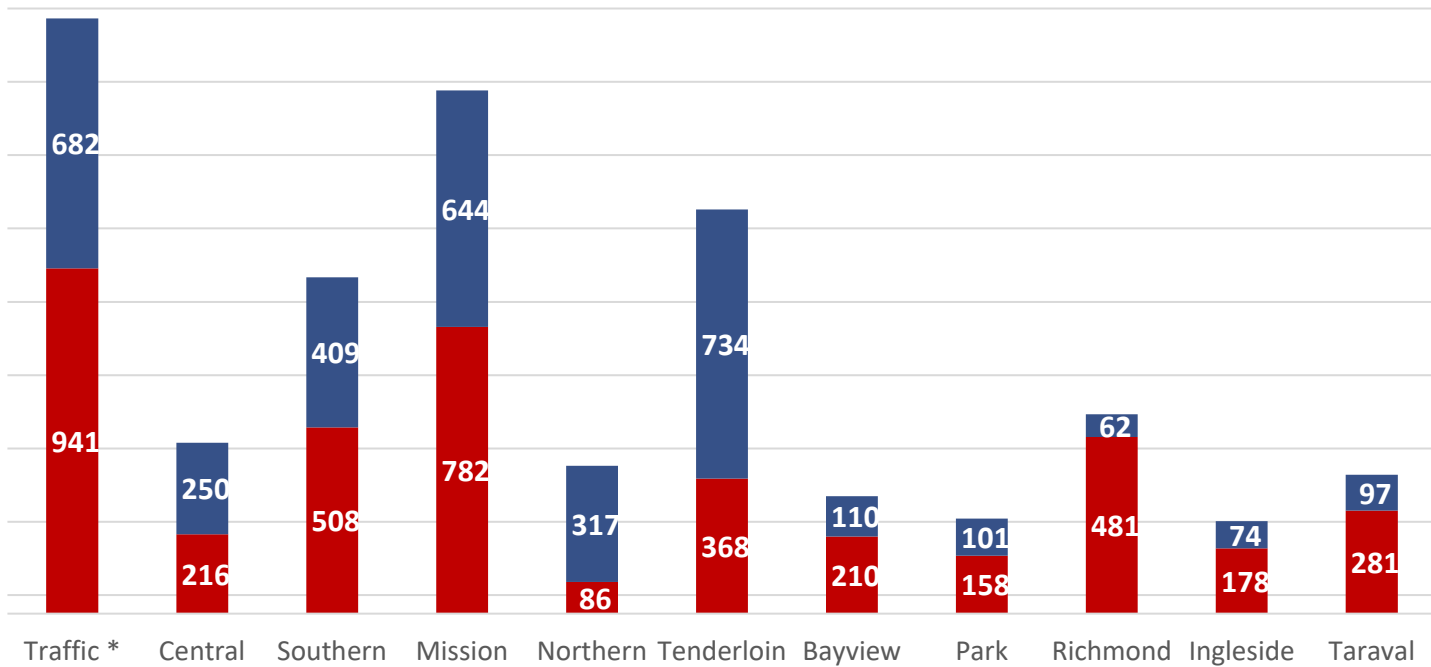

■ Focus on Five Violations    ■ All Other Traffic Violations



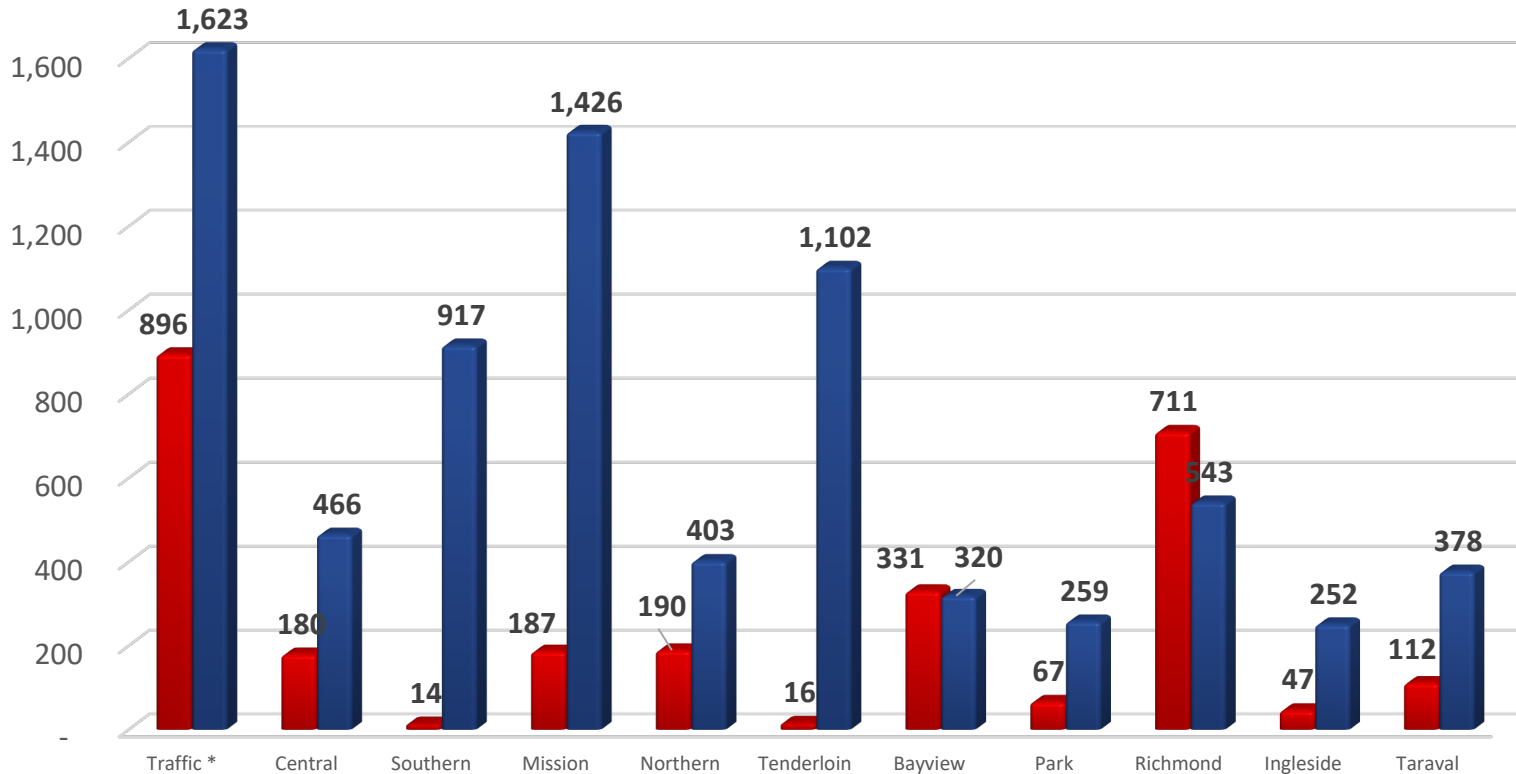

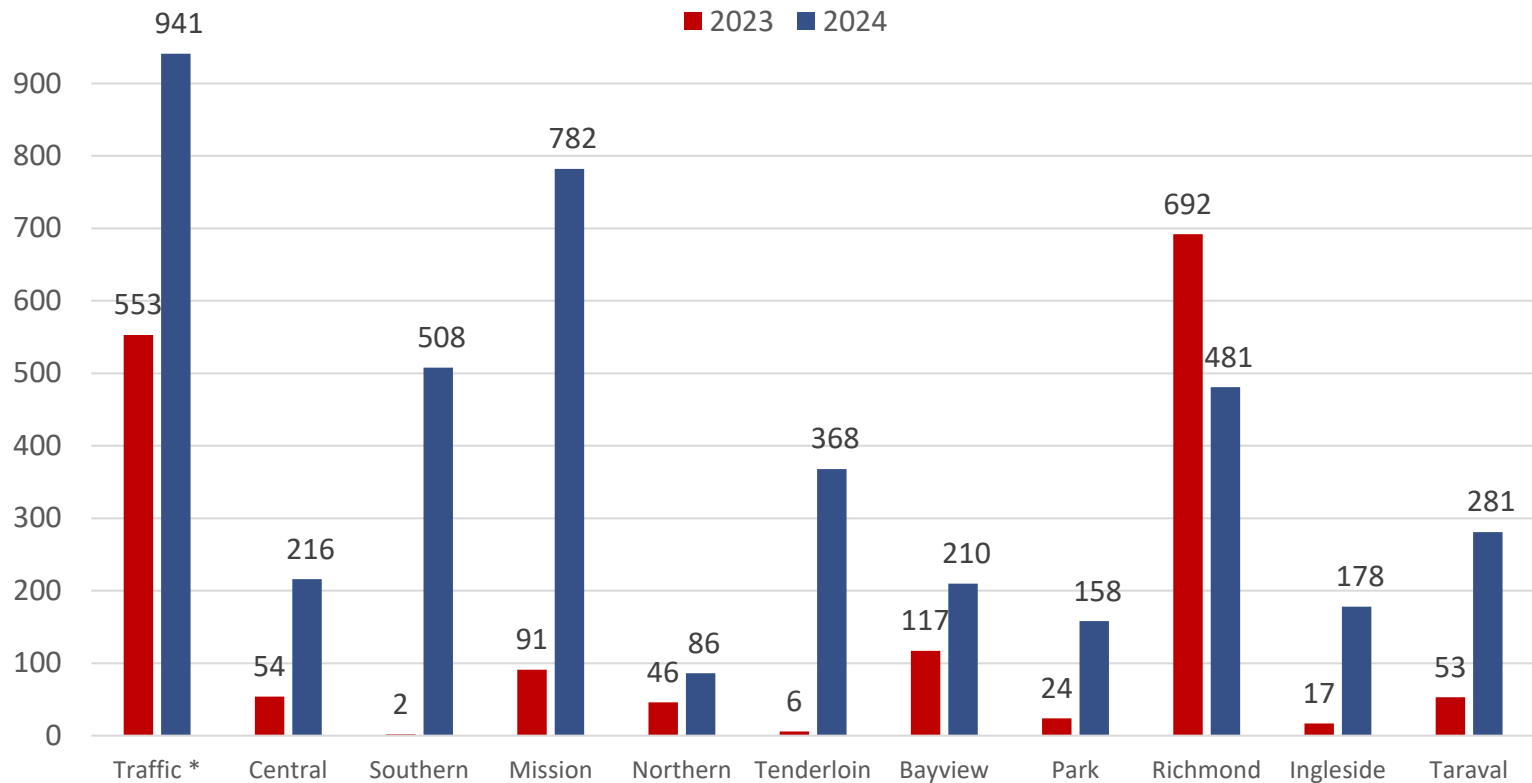

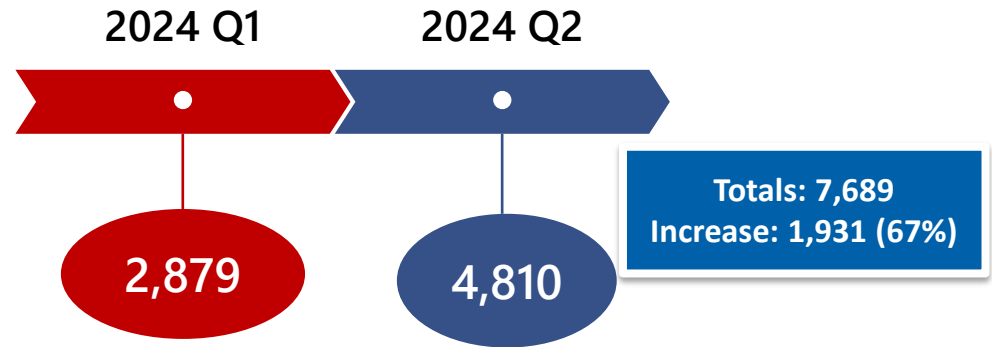

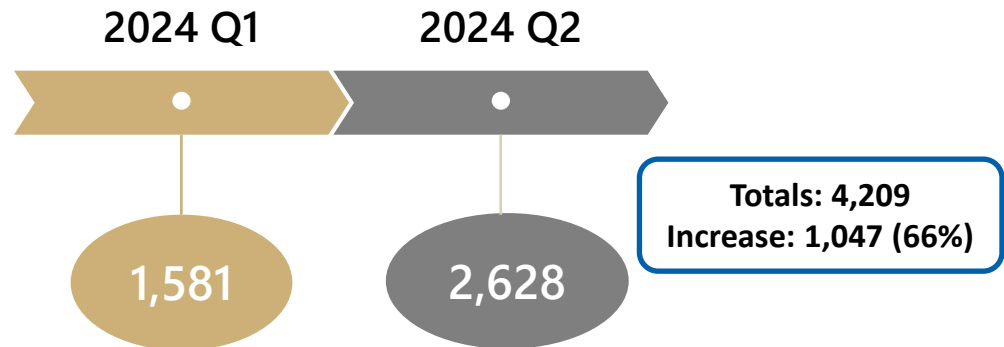

Issuance by Quarter**

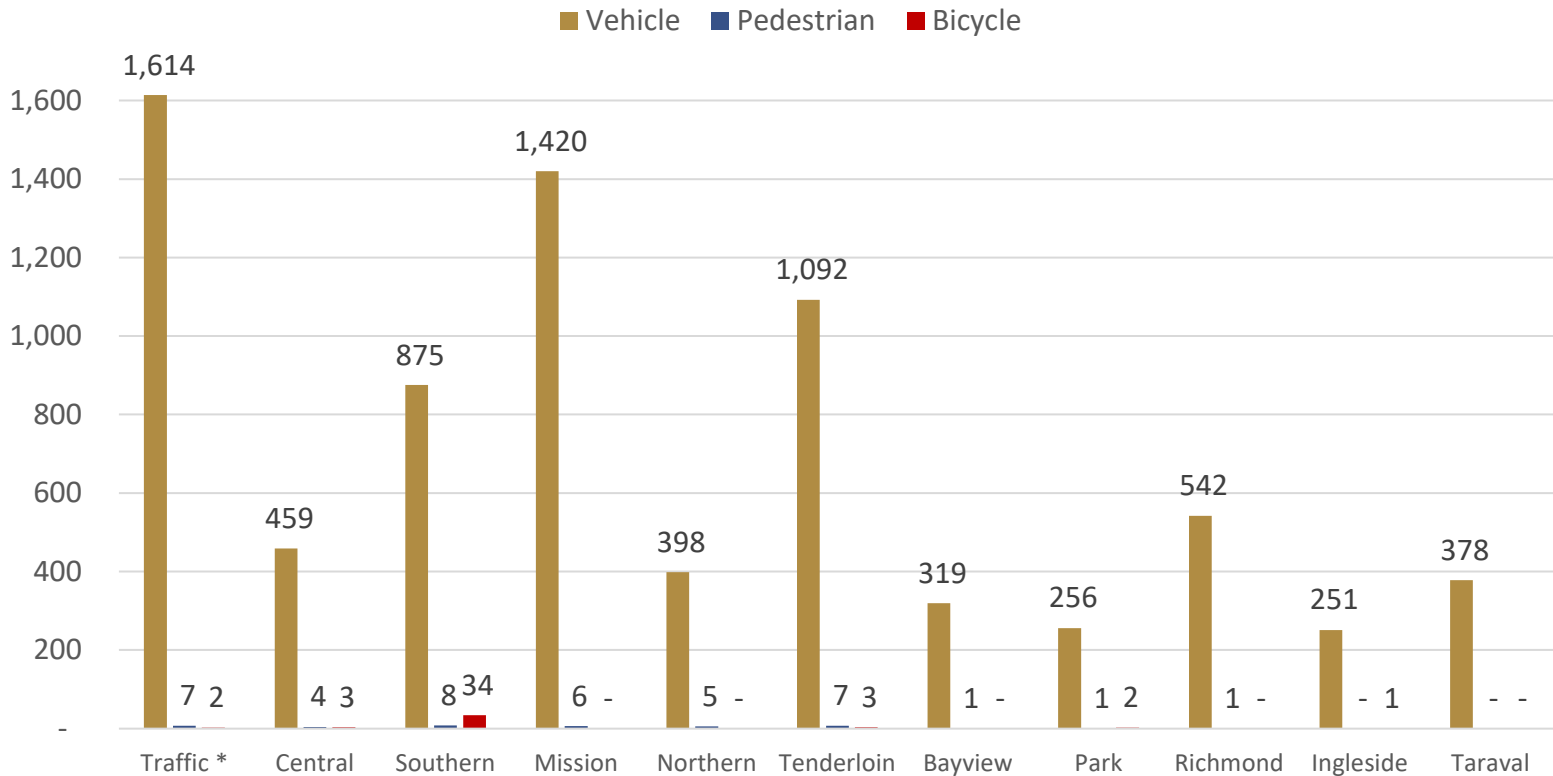

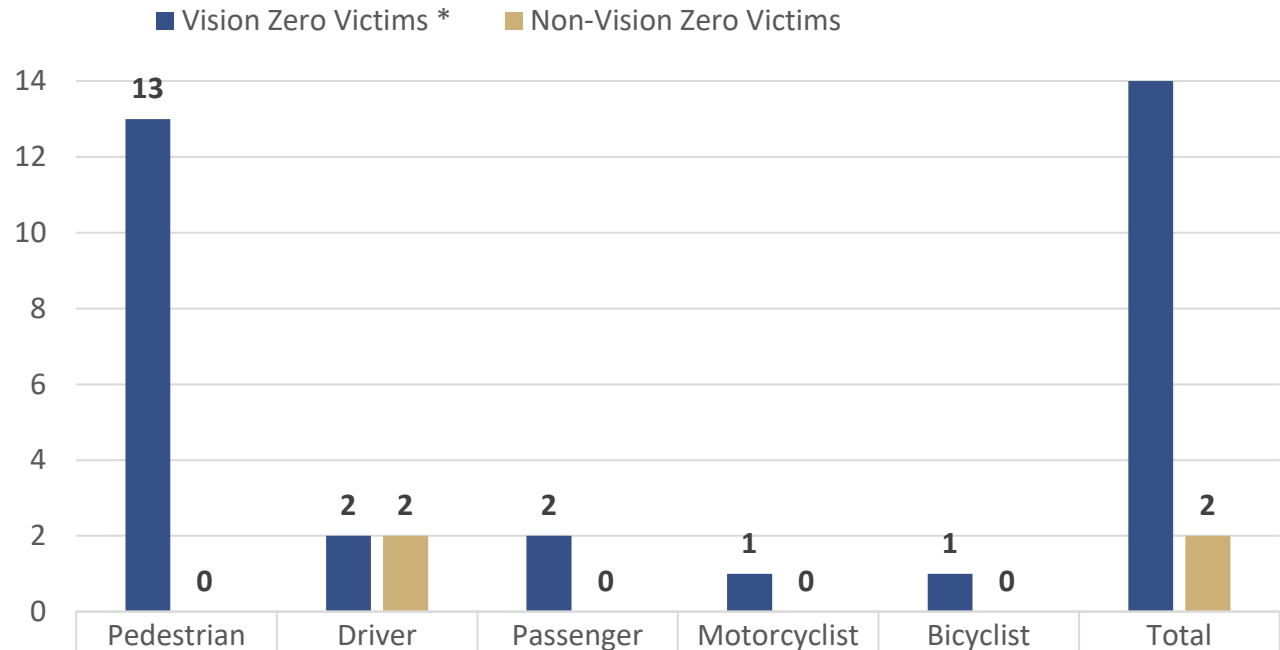
## Department-Wide Traffic Violations by Mode 1/1/2024 – 6/30/2024

**Total Violations Issued to Pedestrians: 40 (0.5%)**  
**Total Violations Issued to Bicyclists: 45 (0.5%)**

### Non-Vision Zero Cases:

1. A driver suffered medical issues prior to a crash at S. Van Ness and 18<sup>th</sup> Street.
2. Crash that occurred on 500 Buckingham Way was excluded as it happened in a parking lot.

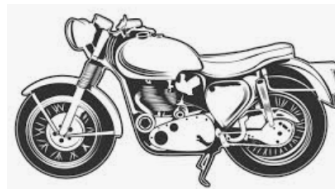

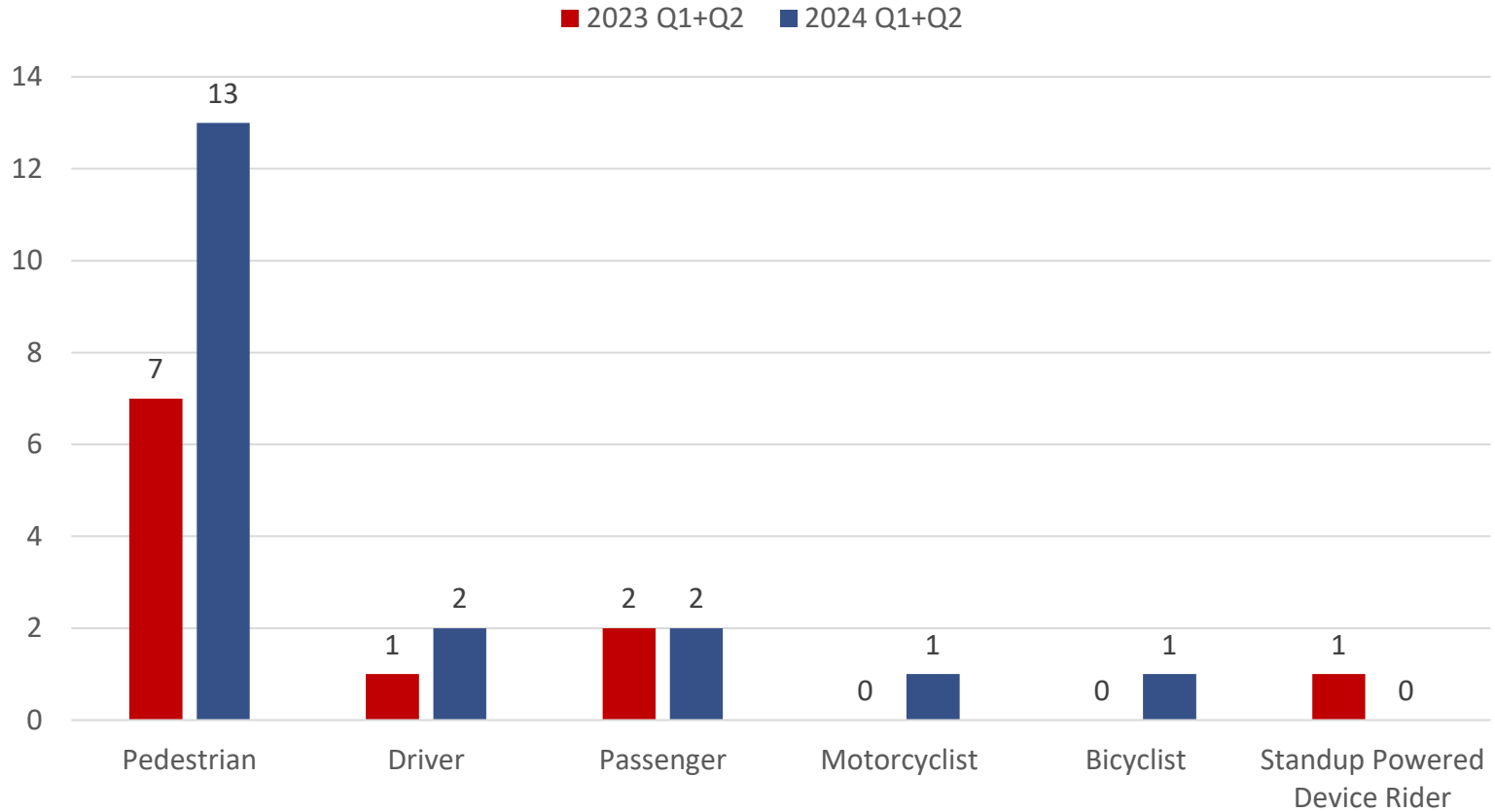
