PURPOSE OF UPDATING POLICY

Recommendation 41.1 of the Collaborative Reform Initiative (CRI) provided guidance on the need to update this manual and staff identified best practices and recommendations from other reform initiatives as an overall framework to follow.

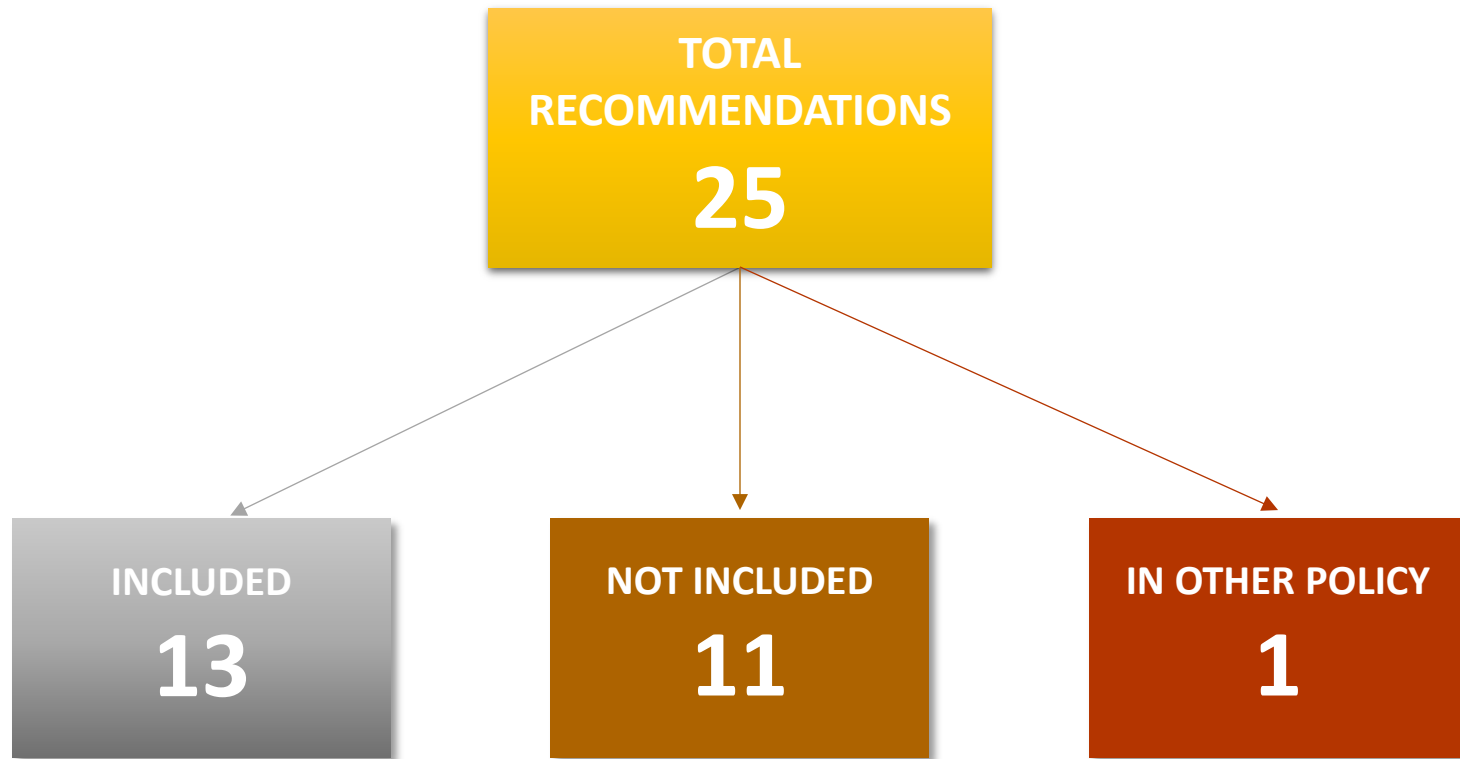
