Members think the 2004 Shelter Training Manual needs significant redesign to make it more impactful and efficient. Perhaps the first three chapters could be mor succinct/merged. Chapter 8 material should be covered in the first three months on the job. Chapter 6 and 7 material should also be prioritized and completed relatively early in the tenure of shelter staff. Important elements may not be shared with news employees for close to a year after they are hired. Harm reduction should have its own chapter. The ADA appears to need more attention.

Member comments: Member Creech suggests that HSH consider getting professional consultants involved in the update of the manual. Chair Street feels key training should be done in at most six months.
