INTRODUCTION

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CARE COORDINATION

Goal: Support youth in their transition to long-term placement and /or permanency by providing a culturally responsive family setting and intensive case management services

CARE COORDINATION

- Individualized intensive case management
- 24/7 immediate responses to Resource Families, crisis response & referrals
- Strength based, trauma-informed, Child and Family Team Meeting participation
- Placement stabilization & emergency care
- Long-term, transition planning AB 12/extended foster care

SPECIALIZED CARE COORDINATION

- **Wisdom Pathways - Trauma-informed interventions rooted in Reparative Parenting and Co-regulation (increase parent confidence and self-efficacy)**
- **PERSISTENCE – agency-wide 4.52% exit AFS from 7 day notices**
- **SUPPORT – Resource Family Mentors, Support Groups, low turnover**
- **Integrated Core Practice Model – needs-driven, family-focused, strength-based, Teaming, Engagement, Service Planning**

THE AGREEMENT

Goal: Provide stable and supportive environment

- a. Individual Training to Support Placement
- b. CFT's Attendance and Participation
- c. Ability to work with Treatment Team
- d. No Refusal

BACKGROUND

- Based on Wrap: a process for helping families achieve independence from formal program supports.

INTENSIVE FAMILY SUPPORT

- Individualized intensive case management
- Support Counselors – Skill building interventions with family, recruits natural supports to join CFT, connects family to resources
- Family Partner- Person with lived-experience engaging the family in participating in the CFT, increased engagement, building bridges
- Use Core Practice Model, Thinking for a Change EBP

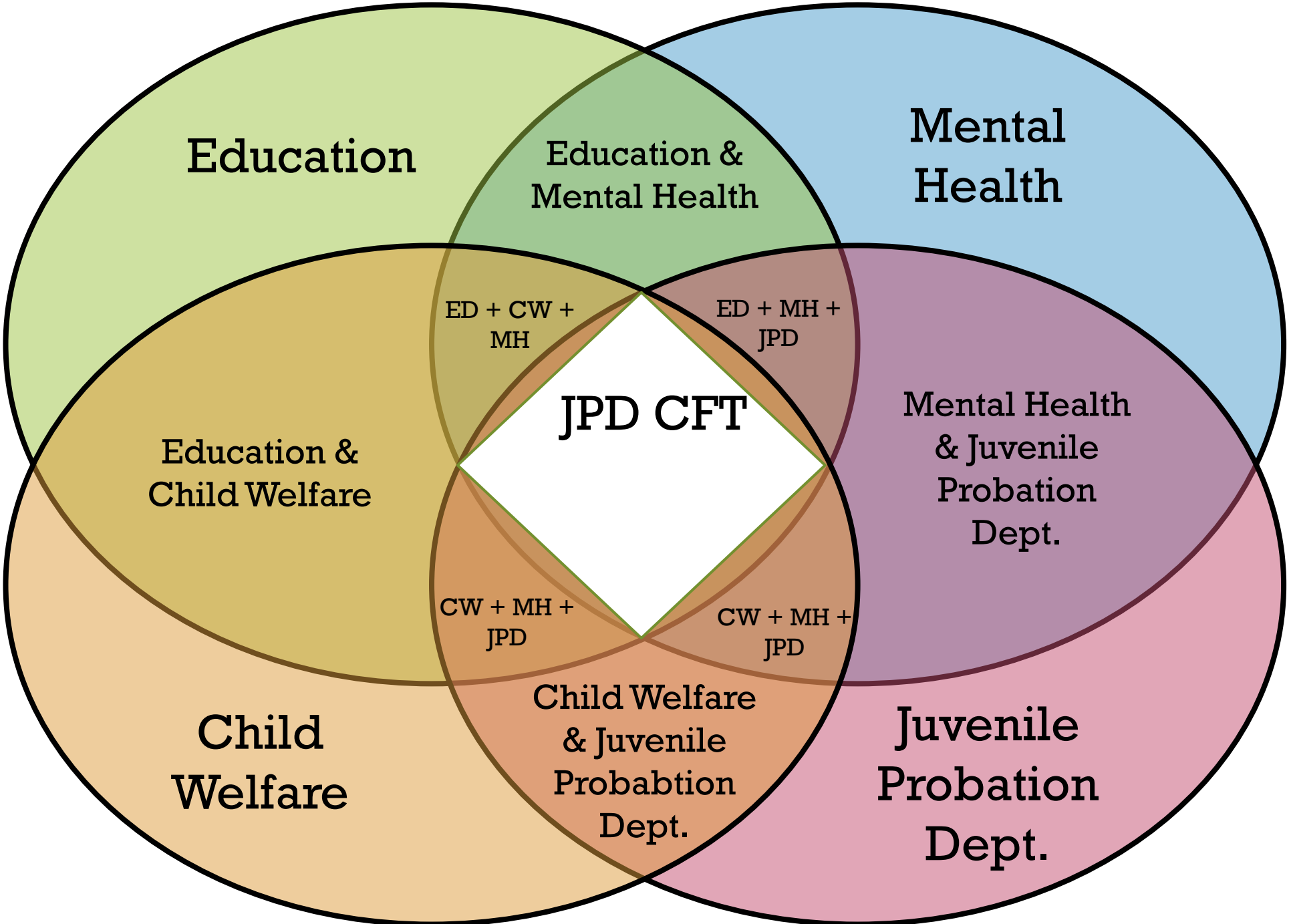
