MinneSLOWta Mural Narrative

Our mission for the Minnesota Slow Street ("MinneSLOWta") is to create a safe and inviting public open space in the heart of Dogpatch for active transportation, recreation, and community events. MinneSLOWta is uniquely situated within the Dogpatch neighborhood as it connects many of our most important public green spaces, including Esprit Park, the Kentucky Place Artwalk, and Woods Yard Park, several dense residential developments, the Institute of Contemporary Art (ICA), as well as our vibrant 22nd St. Commercial District. Showcasing historically-designated homes from the late 1800s - early 1900s, Minnesota Street also sets the stage for a number of annual community events including our Halloween Spooky Slow Street Stroll.

We are excited about the opportunity to install a Street Mural on MinneSLOWta as it will play an important role in our overall plan to transform this wide and tree-lined street into a space that encourages the entire community to utilize it, regardless of their mode transportation. The mural location will be highly visible from several blocks to the North and framed by the 20th St. overpass, inviting folks to explore the neighborhood and further activate the street. Situated on a slight rise going South past 20th St. and adjacent to the Kentucky Place Artwalk, the mural will provide a clear signal that this is a safe and vibrant corridor open to all road users. It will help slow traffic in proximity to pedestrians and cyclists circulating between and around Esprit Park, the ICA, the Dogpatch Community basketball court, multiple preschools, and the 22nd St business district and Caltrain station.

We have surveyed the community for ideas and inspiration and are now working with local artists Josué Rojas and Matley Hurd to create preliminary designs for a colorful and graphic mural drawing on the interplay between Dogpatch's industrial past (victorian working-class houses, cranes, shipbuilding, cordage, canning, steel and ironworks), its natural elements (the waterfront, sunny blue skies, trees and native plantings, rocks and weeds), and our neighborhood's proud artisanal culture (architecture, fashion, art and design studios, museums and galleries, local shops and eateries).

Medium: The mural will be painted with Mural latex paint, NovaColor, Benjamin Moore or equivalent acrylic ground paint in a Matte finish. Artwork will be applied with mainly brushes and rollers. Base coat is the primer. Anti-graffiti coat is the sealer. An anti skid additive will be mixed in with the paint for grit/grip.






MinneSLOWta Proposed Mural Design




MinneSLOWta between 20th & 22nd | Location Map



Matley Hurd is a San Francisco-based visual artist who mainly works in mixed media painting, digital illustration, and large-scale murals. Code §§987 and 989) ("CAPA"), and/or any other local, state, foreign or international law, as currently drafted or as may be hereafter amended, that conveys the same or similar rights ("Moral Rights Laws"), with respect to the Work, its display, removal from display, exhibition, installation, conservation, storage, study, alteration and any other activities conducted by the City, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, licensees, successors or assigns. If the Work is incorporated into a building such that the Work cannot be removed from the building without physical defacement, mutilation, alternation, distortion, destruction, or other modification (collectively, "Modification") of the Work, Artist waives any and all such claims under any Moral Rights Laws arising out of or against any current or future owners of the site, and its agents, officers and employees, for Modification of the Work.

The City has the absolute right to change, modify, destroy, remove, relocate, move, replace, transport, repair or restore the Work, in whole or in part, in City's solediscretion.

The City has no obligation to pursue claims against third parties for modifications or damage to the Work done without the City's authorization. However, the City may pursue claims against third parties for modifications or damage or to restore the Work if the work has been modified without the City's authorization. If the City pursues such a claim, it shall notify the Artist, and Artist shall cooperate with the City's efforts to prosecute such claims.

If the City modifies the Work without the Artist's consent in a manner that is prejudicial to Artist's reputation, Artist retains the right to disclaim authorship of the Work in accordance with 17 U.S.C. § 106A (a) (2).
