


Admissions to Juvenile Hall

- Since January 2020, there have been an average of 23 admissions per month,
 74% of which were mandated by state law.
- In 2023, there 377 admissions:
 - 31 admissions per month on average, 71% of which were mandatory.
 - 40% fewer total admissions than 2019.



Average Daily Population (ADP) in the Juvenile Justice Center


- In 2023, the ADP was 25, 47% lower than in 2018, and 32% lower than in 2019.
- Trends of note:
 - 8% were girls in 2023 vs. 13% in 2022
 - 50% were African American in 2023 vs. 69% in 2022
 - 38% were LatinX in 2023 vs. 19% in 2022
 - 28% were Committed in 2023 vs. 31% in 2022.



Juvenile Arrests/Referrals

- While bookings are down 40% since 2019, overall juvenile arrests in 2023 returned to pre-pandemic levels.
 - There were almost the exact same number of juvenile arrests in 2019 and 2023.
- Notably, while the percentage of all arrests involving girls has been relatively constant, there has been a large decline in the number of girls housed in the Juvenile Justice Center.
 - In 2019, 24% of ADP was girls vs. 8% in 2023.

Referrals by Demographics




Juvenile Arrests/Referrals by Offense Type

• Since 2020:

- 59% of all referrals have been felonies.
- 21% have been 707(b) offenses.
- 34% have been offenses involving violence against people (particularly robbery).


• In 2023:

- 55% of referrals were felonies.
- 17% were 707(b) offenses.
- 28% were offenses involving violence against people (particularly robbery).




Petition Dispositions

- Some trends of note:
 - Out of Home Placement dispositions have declined from 15% of all dispositions in 2020 to 7% in 2023.
 - 654 Informal Probation dispositions have increased from 16% of all dispositions in 2020 to 30% in 2023.



ADP 1997-2024

- In January 1997, there were 140 youth housed in the Juvenile Justice Center.
- In January 2024, there were 28 youth.
