Juvenile Probation Commission meeting

The Juvenile Probation Department would like to direct your attention to the following slides from the July 2024 Monthly Data Report:

JH Chart 1.1: Admissions & Releases (slide 6)

There were 26 admissions to Juvenile Hall in July, down from 38 admissions the month prior and 7% lower than the 2024 YTD average.

JH Chart 1.2: Average & Peak Population (Slide 7)

• In July, the ADP in the Juvenile Justice Center was 27 youth, 13% lower than the 2024 YTD average. The peak population was 32 youth.

PS Chart 1: Referrals to Probation & Diverted Referrals (slide 22)

- There were 62 referrals to JPD in July, 18% lower than the 2024 YTD average.
- The number of referrals to JPD has been declining since reaching its 2024 YTD peak of 107 in May.

PS Chart 8: Petition Dispositions by Month (slide 47)

- The number of court cases reaching a resolution each month has remained high throughout 2024, averaging at 35 cases per month.
- In July, 52% of those cases were dismissed or transferred to another county, meaning that the youths' SF cases were closed altogether.

PS Chart 2.1: Probation Active Caseload (slide 25)

• There were 372 youth on active caseload as of July 31, a 10% decrease since May 31.
