


 HOT Partnership with Episcopal Community Services and Felton Institute to identify and support clients on the street who are eligible for scattered site housing in the Bayview.





Coordinated Entry Assessments














Top 5 Types of Financial Assistance Amount Assistance Move-in assistance for housing outside the San Francisco homelessness \$670,867 response system, including deposits and first and last month's rent Furniture, such as a bed, if reasonable and directly linked to a housing resolution \$115,960 Travel and relocation support outside of San Francisco that will result in a \$115,041 housing connection - airline, train or bus ticket Contribution to rent or utility costs of another household (non lease agreements) \$10.911 if it will allow the participant to move into the unit or maintain/return to the unit Rental assistance after move-in \$9,042




Housing Inventory Dashboard

Housing Placement & Placement Improvements

- Average time from program enrollment to move-in decreased 27 days or 22% since July.
- Improves the experience for clients
- Helps reduce vacancies in permanent supportive housing



Adult & Family Shelter Waiting Lists

Family Shelter Waiting List

There are currently 508 families on the waiting list. 74 of these families are in an HSH-funded, congregate or time-limited family shelter.

106 families joined the waiting list in September 2024.

Average time on waiting list = 46 days (for families who accepted placement offers)

In September 2024, 23 families were placed into non-congregate shelter from the waitlist.

Adult Shelter Waiting List

There are currently 152 people on the waiting list.


559 people joined the waiting list in September 2024.

Average time on waiting list = 11 days (for people who accepted placement offers)

In September 2024, 112 people were placed into shelter from the reservation system.



Adult Shelter Waiting List Metrics: People Joining the Waiting List










Adult Shelter Waiting List Metrics: People Active on the List Over Time





Family Shelter Waiting List Metrics: Families Joining the Waiting List







The Safer Families Initiative:

A \$50M investment to serve SF families experiencing homelessness

Hotel Vouchers for Emergency Shelter for Families

- **→ 115 new vouchers** for emergency shelter for families
 - Of these vouchers, 35 have been operationalized.
 - The remaining 80 hotel vouchers will be added before December 2024.

Rapid Re-Housing for Families

- → 165 new slots for rapid rehousing and shallow rent subsidies for families
 - Referrals beginning this month for 45 slots.
 - HSH expanding existing contracts to administer the remaining 85 slots.
- ► 50 new slots for families headed by young adults



2024-2025 Interfaith Winter Shelter Program



- November 25, 2024, through March 30, 2025
- →Open to single adults for selfreferral daily from 6pm to 7am.
- ← Partnership with Episcopal Community Services, San Francisco Interfaith Council, and many host church sites.
