Treasure Island and Yerba Buena Island Traffic Control & Heavy Equipment Hauling Monday, December 9, 2024 to Wednesday, December 11, 2024

Starting Monday, December 9, 2024 to Wednesday, December 11, 2024, TICD and its contractor will transport the heavy earthmoving scrapers off the Islands from 9am to 11am for each day. Currently, the scrapers are parked at Ave M and 4th Ave on Treasure Island. The scrapers will be loaded on to a transport truck and travel through Treasure Island and Yerba Buena Island to I-80 Bay Bridge west bound on-ramps at Macalla Road and heads towards San Francisco. Please see below for the route map through Treasure Island and Yerba Buena Island.

Street and Traffic Impacts

- Pilot car will guide the wide load transport truck through the streets on TI and YBI. California Highway Patrol (CHP) will also guide and assist on portion of the transport route as the wide loads get to the on ramp and I-80 Bay Bridge.
- Western half of the Causeway (linked road between Treasure Island and Yerba Buena Island) will be closed temporarily during the transport of the wide load.
- Both lanes on Macalla Road on Yerba Buena Island will be closed temporarily (up to 15 mins for each load out) during the transport of the wide load.
- Two (2) loads out are planned for each day from December 9, 2024 to December 11, 2024.
- Pilot car and CHP will assist emergency vehicles to pass through if responding onto or off the island during the closure periods.
- Daytime vehicle traffic and MUNI 25 passengers should expect delays up to 30 minutes leaving the island during the closure periods and plan their travel accordingly on these days.

Solmax's Yerba Buena Island redevelopment project receives IAA award

Solmax recently received the Advanced Textiles Association's (ATA) International 2024 Achievement Award of Excellence in the Geosynthetics Project – Site Development category for its Yerba Buena Island (YBI) redevelopment project.

Yerba Buena Island (YBI) is a natural island located in the San Francisco Bay. It's adjoining island, Treasure, is a man-made island that was built in the 1930s. The city of San Francisco and private developers have been planning a \$1.5 billion redevelopment of the two islands, which spans 405 acres. The project embraces the quintessential California lifestyle, incorporating homes, public transportation, parks and open spaces, public art, hotels, and restaurants.

The first phase of the project included building a residential condominium on the northeast-central side of YBI between I-80 and Macalla Road. Construction of the multimillion-dollar complex required infrastructure improvements and upgrades to Macalla Road.

During a heavy precipitation event in Fall 2021, stormwater runoff built up within the gravel encasement surrounding the stormwater piping beneath Macalla Road. The stormwater buildup increased pore pressure below the subsurface, resulting in slope failure on the north side of the road. The heavily eroded slope was 67°, 120 feet long, and consisted of silty sandy soil. Adding complexity to the project, a sanitary sewer line and a primary natural gas line were on the slope face.

ENGEO, a geotechnical engineering firm, contacted Solmax to help engineer a solution providing slope stability and erosion protection of the slope while also protecting the underground utilities. Incorporating the design factor of safety (FoS) for static and seismic conditions, it was determined that the PROPEX Armormax system was the best solution. PROPEX Armormax is a solution for surficial slope stabilization that provides vegetated reinforcement, improves the factor of safety, and significantly reduces the probability of failure.

The system is composed of Engineered Earth Anchors that are designed and tested for compatibility and performance with PROPEX Pyramat High-Performance Turf Reinforcement Mat (HPTRM) to increase slope stability. Six-foot, B3 anchors on a 5' x 4' spacing with 1,200 pounds of anchor pullout capacity met the design FoS.

Upon approval from all environmental agencies and the city of San Francisco, the slope was rebuilt and PROPEX Armormax was installed in 2022 by Selby's Seed & Erosion Control. Due to the steepness of the slope, installers used harnesses and ropes tethered at the crest of slope for safety. After installation, the HPTRM was sprayed with a bonded fiber matrix containing native seed to establish vegetation. Due to the construction techniques used, no additional construction equipment was required, and no road closures or traffic control were required for Macalla Road.

ENGEO was pleased with the success of this project and has identified additional PROPEX Armormax installations on the Treasure Island/Yerba Buena Island Development Project. The installation was successful, and PROPEX Armormax has been installed on three additional sites on Yerba Buena between 2022 and 2023.

Permits Filed For Bay FC Practice Facility on Treasure Island, San Francisco

Just over a month after its announcement, the new Bay Area women's soccer team, Bay FC, has filed permits for the new permanent training facility at 449 Avenue H on <u>Treasure Island</u>, <u>San Francisco</u>. The application will create a two-story facility and three soccer fields. The <u>Treasure Island Development Authority</u> is listed as the property owner.

From last month's announcement, Bay FC shared they plan to start construction next year, with the facility to open for the 2027 season. The team's CEO, Brady Stewart, shared the following statement alongside their announcement:

"Treasure Island provides us an iconic location to continue to build an iconic club – it centers the Bay's team literally in the middle of the Bay... Having a permanent dedicated space that is built specifically for our players and football operations staff will allow us to continue to attract the best national and international talent and continue our Club's mission of being a catalyst for innovation and change for our athletes and the community."

Bay FC was founded in 2023, with their inaugural season starting in March of this year. The team is the 14th to join the National Women's Soccer League, playing home games at PayPal Park in San Jose.

Demolition will be required for the existing 50,000-square-foot wood-framed building and site clearing of soil across the 8.5-acre parcel. The site has been used as a stockpile for soil related to the various construction projects across Treasure Island and Yerba Buena Island.

Construction will yield a 25,000-square-foot athletic facility between one and two stories tall next to three full soccer fields. Of the three soccer fields, two will feature natural grass, with one artificial turf grass. Surface parking will be included for 100 cars. The indoor facility will include a weight room, medical and wellness center, kitchen and dining room, laundry, locker rooms, lounges, meeting areas, event space, and athletic staff offices.

SF Bay Ferry wins \$55.3M Clean Ports Program grant

A \$55,386,000 grant to the Port of San Francisco included in the \$3 billion of Clean Ports

Program grants announced last month will be used by San Francisco Bay Ferry to create the first zero-emission, fast-ferry network in the U.S.

"This is a transformative project for the Bay Area that both SF Bay Ferry and Hanson Bridgett are honored to be playing a role in," said Steven Miller, a partner at Hanson Bridgett who serves as general counsel of SF Bay Ferry. "This funding will benefit our regional infrastructure immensely while setting a new standard for ferry services in the United States. Its impact on the health of our community will be enormous."

Most of the funding will be used on three projects key to completing San Francisco's vision for an emissions-free fast-ferry network connecting downtown San Francisco, Mission Bay, and the emerging Treasure Island neighborhood. Those projects include constructing a Mission Bay ferry terminal, installing electrification infrastructure at the downtown terminal, and procuring an all-electric, 400-passenger ferry. The grant also includes \$2 million for a maritime workforce development program.

"We are grateful for the U.S. EPA's award to the Port of San Francisco," said Elaine Forbes, executive director of the Port of San Francisco. "This major investment will allow us to complete the Mission Bay Ferry Landing and to achieve an electric fleet, with zero emissions. We look forward to working with our partners at San Francisco Bay Ferry and the SFPUC to provide Bay Area residents with the nation's first zero-emission ferry network, and to bring ferry service to Mission Bay. These EPA funds will also support access to critical, well-paying jobs in the maritime trades."

The Clean Ports Program grant is in addition to the \$100+ million in <u>local</u>, <u>state</u>, <u>and federal funding</u> that SF Bay Ferry has raised to fund its Rapid Electric Emission Free (REEF) Ferry Program, a transformative suite of projects to transition the SF Bay Ferry fleet to zero emissions propulsion technology. The REEF program includes the electrification of ferry floats and the development of the nation's first high-speed, high-capacity, zero-emission vessels. Last year, 2.2 million passengers traveled on the SF Bay Ferry, which already operates the cleanest fleet of high-speed, high-capacity ferries in the U.S.

Yerba Buena Island hosts first annual winter birding walk

On Saturday November 23rd local birders and nature enthusiasts came together for the first annual YBI Winter Birding Walk on-Island. Hosted by TIDA, San Francisco Environment, the Golden Gate Bird Alliance and the California Native Plant Society-Yerba Buena Chapter, the walk was led by ecologists with Habitat Potential, a local small business specializing in natural areas restoration and ecological services.

Braving heavy rain early in the day, the hearty group explored areas of western YBI ripe with winter bird populations including YBI's natural western-facing slopes, the West Stormwater Garden, Treasure Island Causeway and Clipper Cove Beach. The guides explained bird use of YBI for habitat and helped the group in identifying the various bird species observed on-Island over the winter and those bird's distinct markings and calls.

Additional interpretation was provided throughout the walk to educate participants on the local native plant population present on YBI, including those species of value to, and utilized by, YBI's winter bird population. Local species observed on the walk included red-shouldered hawks, red-tailed hawks, great blue herons, cormorants, grebes, loons, brown pelicans, flickers and wrens.

Despite the brief wet weather, the initial event was considered a success and will now become an annual occurrence on the TI/YBI Stewardship Program's calendar of public events.

Pelosi Announces Nearly \$20 Million for Treasure Island Clean Public Transportation

Speaker Emerita Nancy Pelosi announced that San Francisco is set to receive nearly \$20 million in federal grants from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. This federal funding under Democrats' Inflation Reduction Act will benefit disadvantaged communities living on Treasure Island by expanding clean public transportation resources serving the area.

"Thanks to the leadership of the Biden-Harris Administration, our nation's infrastructure is stronger than ever — and San Francisco continues to make progress in our mission to be a transit-smart city," Speaker Emerita Nancy Pelosi said. "The federal EPA grants announced for San Francisco will improve the quality of life for working families living on Treasure Island by increasing access to public transit and reducing pollution in our community. This project will create a cleaner, greener city where reliable public transportation promotes equity and opportunity for all San Franciscans."

The Treasure Island Mobility Management Agency was awarded \$19,965,495 for the Treasure Island Connects project from the U.S. EPA's Environmental and Climate Justice program in a competitive national selection process. This project will fund:

- A microtransit pilot connecting Treasure Island residents to key resources on mainland San Francisco;
- A community circulator shuttle providing Treasure Island residents improved access to more locations on Treasure Island and Yerba Buena Island;
- Enhancements to the existing Muni bus service;
- Electric ferry charging infrastructure to support conversion to zero-emission ferry service;
- Implementation of bikeshare on Treasure Island; and,
- A Transportation Resource Center to provide high quality jobs, training and affordable transit planning for low-income Treasure Island residents.
