The Juvenile Probation Department would like to direct your attention to the following slides from the November 2024 Monthly Data Report:

## JH Charts 4.1 & 4.2: Admissions to Juvenile Hall (slides 17 & 18)

- There were 22 admissions to Juvenile Hall in October, 15% lower than the YTD average.
- 82% of admissions were mandated by state law.

## JH Chart 1.2: Average & Peak Population in the Juvenile Justice Center (slide 7)

- In November, the ADP in the Juvenile Justice Center increased to 30 youth, 10% higher than the 2024 YTD average.
- The peak population in November was 38 youth.

## JH Chart 3.1: Average Length of Stay for Detained Youth Released (slide 14)

In November, the median length of stay for detained youth released increased to 10 days.

## PS Chart 1: Referrals to Probation & Diverted Referrals (slide 22)

- There were 49 referrals to JPD in November, 32% lower than the YTD average.
- 41% of referrals were 707(b) offenses, higher than average.
- 654 diversion and pre-filing diversion has decreased in the latter half of 2024.
