


What is the LBE Program?

The City & County of San Francisco's Contract Monitoring Division (CMD) administers the City's Chapter 14B Local Business Enterprise (LBE) Program. The purpose of the LBE Program is to help small, local businesses compete effectively for City contracts.





The Mission of the LBE Program



Local Business Enterprise (LBE)
 creates opportunities for
 economic justice for San Francisco
 small businesses – especially
 groups historically left out from
 economic growth such as women
 and minority owned firms.

 Stakeholders value the LBE program for its role in creating opportunities, driving economic growth, and long-term stability to the general fund.

What are the benefits

- 1. When bidding as a prime LBEs are eligible for the 10% bid discount/rating bonus
- 2. When bidding as subcontractors LBEs are eligible to be used to meet **LBE subcontracting requirements**
- 3. Micro LBE **Set Aside Contracts**
- 4. SF based LBEs are eligible for benefits for **all** City projects, regardless of location.
- 5. LBEs must be certified on **bid due date** to be eligible for benefits
- 6. City certified LBEs different from State/Federal DBEs
- 7. Networking Opportunities (LBE Directory)

LBE Certification Eligibility Requirements



- Headquarters within San Francisco or Water System Service Area for PUC-LBEs (Majority of Principals)
- Minimum of 6 months in business and in San Francisco or PUC area (SF Business Registration Certificate)
- Owners must have expertise/license in each certification category and have proof of performance
- Gross Receipts within specified economic threshold and all businesses are analyzed
- Truckers and Suppliers have modified requirements

Suppliers/Trucking Firms

Suppliers must maintain a warehouse in San Francisco stocked with inventory consistent with their certification and have a manufacturer's agreement permitting distribution of an item for each category requested.

Trucking Firms, in addition to the local office requirements must possess the appropriate motor vehicle registration in their own name for all trucks and/or trailers used in the business. Trucking Firms must park their vehicles and trailers within the geographical boundaries of SF or the PUC area.

LBE, NPE & PUC-LBE Certified Firms

• The LBE Certification Program is applicable to businesses (includes Non-profits) located in the City and County of San Francisco.

 The PUC-LBE Certification Program is only available to small public works/construction, construction material suppliers, construction equipment rental, trucking, and professional service firms including architecture or engineering firms, that are located within the Water System Service Area.

Economic Thresholds

The 3 year average of gross annual receipts of all businesses under common ownership must not exceed the following limits:

Class A and Class B General Contractors	\$10,000,000	\$20,000,000	\$33,500,000
Specialty Construction Contractors	\$5,000,000	\$10,000,000	\$17,000,000

Professional Services and Architect/Engineering	\$1,250,000	\$2,500,000 \$7,000,000	
Trucking	\$1,750,000	\$3,500,000	\$8,500,000

Steps to Get Certified

- Contract Monitoring Division (CMD) reviews for required and missing documents and contacts applicant in order to:
 - Request missing documents obtaining all required documents takes the most amount of time in the certification process
 - Schedule a Site Visit Required


