

People eligible for the vaccine now are:

As of April 1, 2021:

- Healthcare workers
- People 50 years and older
- Education and childcare workers
- Emergency services workers
- Food and agriculture workers
- People living or working in congregate living settings (homeless shelters, correctional facilities, or other treatment facilities)
- People experiencing homelessness
- Janitors and public transit workers
- People with certain health conditions or disabilities
 - Cancer
 - · Chronic kidney disease
 - Severe chronic pulmonary disease, including COPD and those who are oxygen dependent
 - Down syndrome
 - Immune compromise from blood, bone marrow, or solid organ transplant; immune deficiencies; HIV; use of corticosteroids; or use of other immune weakening medicines
 - Pregnancy
 - Sickle cell disease
 - Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies (excludes hypertension)
 - Obesity (BMI greater than 30)
 - Diabetes

COST: Vaccines are **free** to people who live and work in San Francisco.

INSURANCE: You do **not** need insurance to book an appointment.

How do I prove I'm eligible?

You may bring documentation if you have it. However, self-attestation is the only requirement.

If I'm eligible, how do I sign up to get a vaccine?

Visit **sf.gov/GetVaccinated** to learn where to sign up for an appointment and other options for receiving the vaccine.



Even if you are eligible, there may not be a dose available right now. If you are eligible, check back regularly for appointments.

Getting vaccinated will help keep you, your family, and your community safe and healthy.
