



Getting your COVID-19 vaccine

Find out when it will be your turn to receive the COVID-19 vaccine

The COVID-19 vaccines are here, but supply is low. The state has created a population prioritization plan for who gets the vaccine and when. It's based on the risk of getting COVID-19 or getting very sick from COVID-19.

When will I be eligible?

Sign up at sf.gov/VaccineNotify to find out where you are on the vaccine priority list if you live or work in San Francisco.



- Registration requires an email address or cell phone number for notifications.
- You may sign up for others, such as your family members.
- After you receive the notification, you may need to contact your healthcare provider to schedule your vaccination appointments.

If I'm eligible, how do I sign up to get a vaccine?

Visit sf.gov/GetVaccinated to learn where to sign up for an appointment and other options for receiving the vaccine.



Even if you are eligible, there may not be a dose available right now. If you are eligible, check back regularly for appointments.

Where will I get the COVID-19 vaccine?

Many people will get vaccinated at one of the **high-volume sites** that the City and local healthcare providers are currently setting up. Vaccines will also be provided through:

- Select community clinics and pharmacies
- Neighborhood vaccine access sites
- Healthcare providers

Vaccines are free to people who live or work in San Francisco.

You do not need insurance to book an appointment.
