

Examples of Covered Contracts for Contractor Vaccination Policy

Example	Covered?
Professional Services Contract	
1. Contractor Employee with a workstation at an indoor City office space and works there on a regular basis.	Yes
2. A Contractor Employee visits a City office space for a one-time, two-hour, in person meeting.	No
3. A Contractor Employee visits a City office space for a four-hour or less, in person meeting once per week.	No
4. A Contractor Employee providing on-site, in person training at an office setting for more than six hours per day, three times in one week.	Yes
5. A Contractor Employee working remotely fulltime.	No
Public Works Contract	
6. A Contractor Employee working on a job site where City Employees are also working within 6-feet for more than 4 cumulative hours in a day.	Yes
7. A Contractor Employee working for more than 4 cumulative hours in one day in a trailer office or site office where City employees also work.	Yes
8. A Contractor Employee is on a job site where a City Employee visits for a four hour or less, one-time inspection or site visit.	No
9. Contractor Employee performing field work not within 6-feet of City Employees.	No
10. Contractor Employee visiting a City worksite for one-time deliveries or inspections who will be on-site for up to four hours.	No
11. Contractor Employee visiting a City worksite to install a new piece of equipment (i.e., HVAC, boiler, security system) for a multiple day project working within 6 feet of a City Employee and will be on site for over 20 hours in a two-week period.	Yes
Nonprofit or Grant Agreement	
12. A Contractor Employee stationed at the Contractor Employer offices or worksite where no City employees work.	No
13. A Contractor Employee stationed at the Contractor Employer offices or worksite where City employees (i.e., Eligibility Workers or Case Workers) work and the City controls the worksite.	Yes
14. A City Employee (i.e., Program Monitor) visits a Contractor Employer office or worksite for less than 4 hours.	No
General Services	
15. A Contractor Employee security guard stationed at City-owned office building where City Employees are working and must pass by, such that the security guard is within 6 feet of City employees more than four hours a day.	Yes
16. A Contractor Employee security guard stationed at a work site where no City Employee works.	No
17. A Contractor Employee janitor working for more than four hours in a City-owned office space where City Employees regularly work.	Yes
18. Contractor Employee visiting a City worksite for maintenance and repairs and working within 6 feet of a City Employee for a one-day, on-site project.	Yes
19. A Contractor Employee shuttle bus driver driving City Employees more than 15 hours a week.	Yes
