Rescheduled Meeting

1. Call to Order and Roll Call

The Redistricting Task Force met in rescheduled session, in-person with remote access and public comment via telephone and videoconference, on Wednesday, April 13, 2022. Chair Reverend Arnold Townsend called the meeting to order at 3:18 p.m.

On the call of the roll, Chair Townsend, Member Jeremy Lee, Member Hernández Gil, Member Pierce, Member Castillon, Member Ho, Member Cooper, Member Chasel Lee, and Member Reiner were noted present. Member Jeremy Lee and Vice Chair Reiner were attending remotely.

A quorum was present.

2. Final Draft Map

Chair Townsend shared that he is considering extending the Task Force work on the map, and is entertaining the thought of surpassing the April 15, 2022, Final Map deadline. Ana Flores, Deputy City Attorney (Office of the City Attorney), Jaime Clark, Redistricting Consultant (Q2 Data and Research); and Angela Calvillo, Clerk of the Board (Board of Supervisors); answered questions raised throughout the discussion.

Member Pierce moved that the Final Draft Map be rejected and that the work of the Task Force should continue. The motion died by a lack of a second.

Member Ho offered a technical adjustment to the Final Draft Map to add a portion of the Potrero Annex to District 10, with boundaries at Cesar Chavez, Connecticut Street, 26th Street, Wisconsin Street, 23rd Street, Missouri Street, Sierra Street, 22nd Street, and Interstate 280. This change would adjust the district for more than 1,100 people and could not be offered as a technical adjustment. The adjustment was not made to the Final Draft Map.

Members Castillon and Chasel Lee offered technical adjustments to the Final Draft Map as follows:

- Unify the two halves of the Golden Gate Park panhandle bounded by Stanyan Street, Fell Street, Oak Street, and Masonic Avenue within District 5;
- Add the area bounded by Van Ness Avenue, Dr. Tom Waddell Place, and Carleton B. Goodlett Place to District 5;
- Add the Margaret Hayward Playground in Jefferson Square Park to District 5;
- Add one block to the west of Edgewood Avenue in Parnassus Heights to District 8;
- Add the San Francisco Zoo to District 7; and
- Add all of Saint Luke's Hospital between Guerrero Street and Tiffany Avenue to District 9.

These changes were not made to the Final Draft Map.

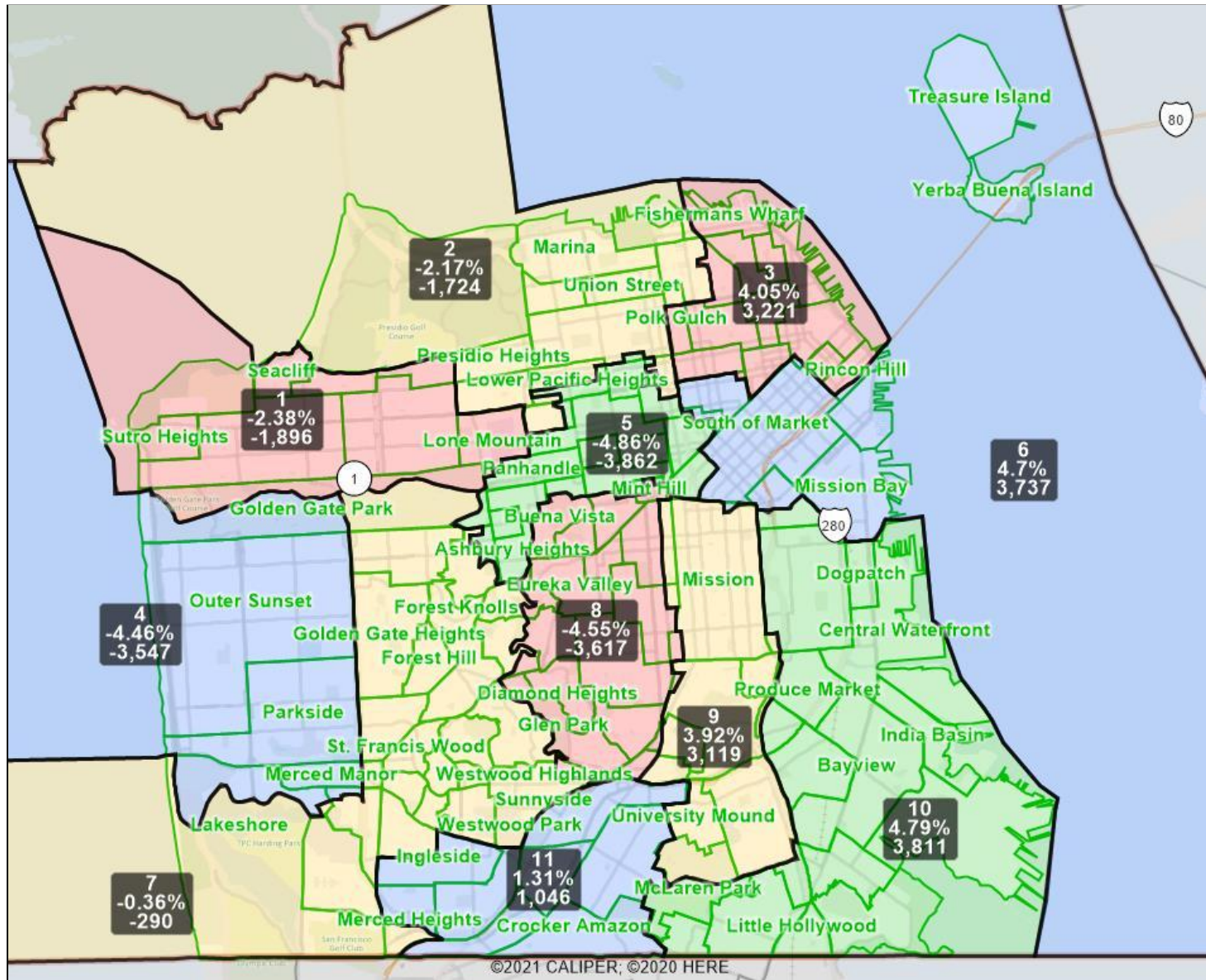

This map has been referred to in the community informally by various names, including the “Blow-Up” map and the “Healing” map. Jaime Clark, Redistricting Consultant (Q2 Data and Research) shared that she would prepare this map for presentation to the Task Force and that it would be named Map 7.
