- 1. Motion to authorize the Director of Cultural Affairs to increase the contract with artist Hiroshi Sugimoto (DBA Door Four LLC) from \$1,750,000 to \$1,787,500 (an increase of \$37,500) for the design, fabrication, transportation and consultation during installation of an artwork for the Yerba Buena Island Hilltop Park, as recommended by the Treasure Island Art Steering Committee.
- 2. Motion to approve Crossroads of Flight, a mural design by artist Cece Carpio, Miguel Perez, and Josue Rojas. The mural will be installed on 681 Florida St. between 18th and 19th St. in District 9. The mural is a triptych, measuring: 75 ft. 4 ½ in, by 11 ft. 1/2 in.; 81 ft. 10 ½ in by 11 ft. 1/2 in.; 58 ft. 5 in. by 44 ft. 11 in. The project is funded by the Mission Economic Development Agency and the Tenderloin Neighborhood Development Corporation. The artwork will not become part of the Civic Art Collection.























Portsmouth Square Clubhouse- Plaza Elevation

PORTSMOUTH SQUARE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT PUBLIC ART PROJECT PLAN

For presentation to Visual Arts Committee February 16, 2022



BACKGROUND

Portsmouth Square, located in Chinatown, is one of San Francisco's most significant historic, cultural, and civic spaces. The park, located above the Portsmouth Square parking garage, will receive a complete renovation with funding from the 2020 Health and Recovery Bond. The design is the result of a robust community engagement and participatory design process, and is reflective of the significance of the neighborhood, and addresses programmatic challenges unique to Chinatown. The renovation generates an Art Enrichment (AE) budget of \$104,000 and the Arts Commission under Resolution 1102-20-189 approved the use of these funds for the conservation of the existing artwork in the Civic Art Collection at the square. Based on input from Commissioners and community stakeholders, the Arts Commission has identified an additional \$104,000, with approval by the City Administrator's Office, from AE funds from the 49 South Van Ness project, for the commission of a new artwork at Portsmouth Square.

ART OPPORTUNITY

SFAC in conjunction with Rec and Park and community stakeholders have identified the glass façade of the new community clubhouse as the artwork opportunity. An artist's design will be integrated into part of the glass façade of the new center, with consideration given to the glass above the entrances to the clubhouse, or to part of the south facing elevation as it faces the interior of the plaza.

PROJECT GOAL

The goal of the project is to create a signature artwork that is inspired by and celebrates the people, history and culture of San Francisco's Chinatown community.

AE and ARTWORK BUDGET

The total AE budget is \$104,000. The artwork budget is \$59,000 inclusive of design, insurance, fabrication and installation.

ARTIST RECRUITMENT APPROACH AND ELIGIBILITY

Arts Commission staff will post an RFQ, which is open to professional practicing artists who reside in the United States. Recruitment will focus on artists with a meaningful connection to the San Francisco Chinatown community, which may include if the artist currently resides, has resided, or has another significant connection to San Francisco Chinatown. An artist's meaningful connection to San Francisco Chinatown will be a scoring criteria during the artist selection process.

ARTIST SELECTION PROCESS

After the application deadline the Arts Commission staff will screen applications to establish the pool of artists meeting the minimum eligibility requirements.

The eligible applications will be presented to an artist qualification panel consisting of 2 arts professionals and 1 SFAC staff, who will review and score the applications to identify the short list of qualified artists to be considered for the project opportunity.

The list of qualified artists will be presented to the Portsmouth Square Improvement Artist Review Panel consisting of one representative of the client agency, two arts professionals, an Arts Commissioner, and one community member. The panel will identify 3 finalists who will be invited to develop conceptual site-specific proposals after attending an orientation session with the project team and key stakeholders. These finalists will be paid an honorarium of \$1,000, inclusive of any travel costs for development of a proposal.

The Portsmouth Square Improvement Artist Review Panel will reconvene to consider the finalists' proposals in an interview format and will select one artist for recommendation to the Art Commission.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

- SFAC staff will present an overview of the public art project and artist application workshop to the community; pending availability of additional funds, SFAC staff may work with a community-based organization for additional outreach and application support.
- A community representative will serve on the Portsmouth Square Improvement Artist Review Panel and will participate in the Artist Orientation
- The finalists' proposals will be on display for public comment near the project site and on the SFAC website for two weeks prior to the final review panel meeting. The comments will be shared to the artist review panel.
- All review panels, Visual Arts Committee (VAC) and Commission meetings are open to the public.






Sculpture Honoring Dr. Maya Angelou Portrait of a Phenomenal Woman by Lava Thomas

Author, poet, activist, mother, feminist, global citizen, educator and much more, Dr. Maya Angelou's extraordinary life, spirit and works are commemorated in the sculpture Portrait of a Phenomenal Woman. At a total height of 9 feet, the sculpture's monumental scale speaks to Dr. Angelou's towering achievements in the face of adversity and celebrates her lasting impact on humanity. The sculpture is fabricated in bronze which suggests timelessness and permanence, with a rich patina that conveys the warmth that Dr. Angelou exuded throughout her life.


The sculpture is inspired by the form of a book with the author's name on its spine in bold capital letters. A portrait of Dr. Angelou appears on the sculpture's surface, translated in shallow relief from an original drawing. Based on a still from a 1973 interview with the author, the portrait depicts Dr. Angelou as if she is about to speak, captured in thought with her gaze directed toward the viewer as she discusses pressing social and political issues that still resonate today. By portraying the author as a young woman, the sculpture serves as a role model for a younger generation, particularly for young women and girls.








"Information helps you see that you're not alone. That there's somebody in Mississippi and somebody in Tokyo who all have wept, who've all longed and lost, who've all been happy. So the library helps you to see, not only that you are not alone, but that you're not really different from everyone else. There may be details that are different, but a human being is a human being."





CHANGES TO ORIGINAL PROPOSAL:

- Sculpture will be fabricated from a 3-d model of the book
- 2. Base material is basalt, not concrete
- 3. Text has been taken off base

The back of the sculpture bears a quote that emphasizes the importance of libraries in shaping her work's guiding philosophy. As Dr. Angelou continues to illuminate our world through her life and words, Portrait of a Phenomenal Woman creates an inspiring presence on Civic Center Plaza, encouraging us to find our own voice and courage while reminding us that despite our differences, we all belong to the human family.




Sculpture sits on a basalt base






















SEP Fence Temporary Public Art Program


- A series of temporary artworks for the SEP
 Headworks Facility construction safety fence on
 Evans Avenue between Rankin and Phelps
 Streets.
- Each installation will be on view for approximately one year starting Summer 2020 through Fall 2024.
- Artist will be responsible for the artwork design only. Artwork design will be translated into mesh vinyl banners and installed under a separate contract with a sign company.
- The SEP Headworks Facility construction safety fence measures 6' x 624'. The available artwork area is approximately 2,400 square feet (400' x 6'). Artist may choose to do one large design, or a series of smaller designs for the available artwork area.

Project Goals

- Artwork will reflect and celebrate the vibrancy and pride of the Bayview-Hunters Point, its people, values, and history.
- Artwork will promote environmental stewardship, which is central to the mission of the SFPUC.
- Artist will have a meaningful connection to Bayview-Hunters Point.
- Artist will engage Bayview-Hunters Point youth, seniors, schools, and/or community organizations in the development of the artwork design.
 - In conjunction with the SEP Headworks
 Construction Fence Temporary Public Art
 Program, an annual summer internship
 opportunity will be offered to Bayview Hunters Point high school students
 through an established SFPUC internship
 program.



PROCESS

Arts Commission staff presented the qualifications of 22 artists selected from the Bayview Artist Registry. "Yes/No" majority votes based on the criteria of Artistic Merit, Demonstrated Ability to Meet Project Goals, and Meaningful Connection to Bayview Hunters-Point yielded 10 artists to move to Round Two.

Round 2:

The Artist Selection Panel discussed the qualifications of the 10 semi-finalists and scored each artist on the following criteria (1= low score):

- Artistic Merit (1-5)
- Demonstrated Ability to Meet Project Goals (1-2)
- Meaningful Connection to Bayview Hunters-Point (1-3)

The Review Panel voting yielded 2 artists to recommend to the Arts Commission.


