

## OCOH Oversight Committee Community Liaisons

The Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee appoints members to carry out specific tasks as Liaisons. Activities include convening stakeholders, communicating with City Departments and Offices, and coordinating the development of spending recommendations.

Liaisons are designated by the Committee and serve at the direction of the Committee. Liaison roles can be created or dissolved by Committee vote.

Unlike Committee meetings, Liaison activities do not need to be publicly noticed. No more than four Committee members can participate in an activity or consult (the Liaison plus three additional members, maximum).

### Liaison Responsibilities

- Liaisons coordinate the drafting of spending plan recommendation in their designated area. This includes meeting with Departments, soliciting stakeholder input, collecting information, evaluating community needs, and drafting spending recommendations for Committee review and vote.
- Liaisons ensure transparency and accessibility of Committee activities related to their area.
- Liaisons consult with Departments in developing "spotlight" presentations that highlight OCOH program implementation and strategic vision.
- Liaisons engage in research activities as needed.
