



How can I get a record of my MPX vaccination?

Ask for documentation when you get vaccinated

Ask for a record of your vaccination when you get vaccinated. This may be a yellow card or a print-out of your vaccination. There is no official 'card' for MPX vaccinations. Some vaccine sites use a 'yellow card', and others provide a print-out.

If you did not receive a record of your vaccination

1) Check your medical record or ask your provider

You can find it in your online health record under the immunization history section. If you don't see it, ask your healthcare provider. Your provider should have a record of vaccination dates and locations. They can also print your immunization record through the [California Immunization Registry \(CAIR\)](#)

2) Request a record from CAIR

The California Immunization Registry (CAIR) is a secure [immunization information system for California](#). Fill out this [form](#) to get your record emailed to you. Requests may take up to 14 business days, so please plan ahead.

Travelers from outside the U.S. who get vaccinated in California may email the [Help Desk](#) to get the form.

CAIR was not designed for a high volume of requests. Use this method if the above options are not possible.

When is it time for your second dose of MPX vaccine?

If this is your first dose, don't forget to complete your 2nd dose! You should get your 2nd dose at 28 days or later after your first dose. You can set a reminder in your phone or mark your calendar. If you are not local, visit the [MPX Vaccine Locator](#) for locations near you.
