SPY Admissions COVID-19 Screen Updated 4.29.2020

Step 1: If youth is not already wearing a mask, give youth a mask to put on. Give youth a paper bag in which to store their mask when in their room. Explain to youth that everyone at JJC must wear a mask when around others.

Step 2: Write order in youth's MAR for "Give new mask when soiled, damaged, or wet until further notice." Document each time a new mask is given to the youth.

Step 3: Check Vital Signs: Temp_____ BP_____ P_____ RR_____

Step 4: (Updated 4/29/20) Does youth have ONE or more of the following symptoms:

- Body/muscle aches ◦Chills ◦Cough ◦Diarrhea or vomiting ◦Fatigue ◦Fever ($\geq 100^{\circ}\text{F}/37.8^{\circ}\text{C}$)
- Headache ◦Loss of smell or taste ◦Nasal congestion ◦Runny nose ◦Shortness of breath
- Sore throat

If NO, skip to Step 5. If YES, complete Step 4.

- Place youth in a holding cell and ask those nearby to maintain a distance of 6ft from the youth.
- While maintaining a distance of 6 ft from the youth, ask the following questions:

- 1) When did their symptoms begin? Date sxs started_____
- 2) Have they been in close contact with anyone who has been diagnosed with or is suspected of having COVID-19?
If yes, when did this contact occur? _____

Note: Close contact is defined as-

o Being within approximately 6 feet of a COVID-19 case for a prolonged period; close contact can occur while caring for, living with, visiting, or sharing a healthcare waiting area or room with a COVID-19 case -OR- o Having direct contact with infectious secretions of a COVID-19 case (e.g., being coughed on)

- Call to consult with SFDPH Communicable Disease Control & Prevention at

415-554-2830 (M-F 8:30am-5pm) and at 415-554-3613 (after-hours)

- Let the Operator know you are a nurse calling from juvenile hall about a youth with symptoms concerning for COVID-19.
- Leave your name and a call-back number.
- When the doctor calls you back, provide them with the information you have gathered.
- The doctor will let you know if the youth should be tested for COVID-19 and flu.
- If COVID-19 testing is recommended, admit youth to JJC following the instructions on the **SPY COVID-19 Medical Isolation/Quarantine Procedures** form.
- If COVID-19 testing is recommended, obtain a PUI case number for the test.
- Ask Communicable Disease Control to send a Public Health Nurse to JJC to collect specimens from the youth ASAP (our NP has been deployed and we do not have a regularly scheduled provider to obtain specimen). Coordinate transport of specimens to SFDPH Public Health Lab at 101 Grove St.
- If Communicable Disease Control **does not** advise testing youth for COVID-19, admit youth following per standard procedure.

Step 5: If youth DOES NOT present with any of the following:

- Body/muscle aches ◦ Chills ◦ Cough ◦ Diarrhea or vomiting ◦ Fatigue ◦ Fever (**≥100°F/37.8°C**)
- Headache ◦ Loss of smell or taste ◦ Nasal congestion ◦ Runny nose ◦ Shortness of breath
- Sore throat

Ask the youth the following question:

- 1) Have they been in close contact with anyone who has been diagnosed with or is suspected of having COVID-19 within the past 14 days?

If yes, when did the last contact occur?: _____

If YES to question 1,

- Let the Operator know you are a nurse calling from juvenile hall about a youth who may have been exposed to COVID-19 but is asymptomatic.
- Leave your name and a call-back number.
- When the doctor calls you back, provide them with the information you have gathered.
- The doctor will let you know if the youth should be tested for COVID-19.
- If COVID-19 testing is recommended, admit youth to JJC following the instructions on the **SPY COVID-19 Medical Isolation/Quarantine Procedures** form.
- If COVID-19 testing is recommended, obtain a PUI case number for the test.
- Ask Communicable Disease Control to send a Public Health Nurse to JJC to collect specimens from the youth ASAP (our NP has been deployed and we do not have a regularly scheduled provider to obtain specimen). Coordinate transport of specimens to SFDPH Public Health Lab at 101 Grove St.

If NO to question 1,

- Admit youth to JJC per standard procedure.
