My name is Hannah Lawson, and I am a fourth-year doctoral student in clinical psychology at the California School of Professional Psychology, at Alliant International University in San Francisco Bay Area. I am currently interning at the Federal Correctional Institute at Terminal Island providing individual and group treatment for incarcerated men. I have previous experience as a clinician providing sex offender treatment for men on probation and parole and as a clinician for mandated and non-mandated sexual offenders and individuals with acting out behaviors. While my experience has been primarily with men, I am also interested in research for women with experience with the criminal justice system.

While interning at FCI Terminal Island, I am also developing my dissertation. My study aims to gain a deeper understanding of the individuals working with females that have experienced incarceration and participation in the process of release planning toward a successful return to their community. Hopefully, such information gathered would help with future improvements to this process and address the unique needs of women. I recently was approved to collect data by interviewing professionals that have experience working with women who were previously incarcerated. Currently, I am recruiting interested individuals and collecting data to identify the strengths and weaknesses of reentry for women.
