Policy Title: Health Clearance for In-Custody Work and Program Assignments Corresponds to: Title 15, Article 8, Section 1414	Written: 3/15/2013






I. POLICY

As part of the history and physical at JJC and health clearance for youth, no youth with a serious infectious illness that may be transmitted through food will be cleared to handle food.

II. PROCEDURES

- A. The history and physical will include assessment of exposure to and symptoms of food borne contagious diseases, especially hepatitis and diarrheal disease by history; a physical examination to exclude infected skin lesions, tenderness of the liver and jaundice, and life-threatening allergies.
- B. If during any routine or acute medical exam at JJC, a youth is found to have a serious infectious illness which may be transmitted through food, the medical provider will write a cottage order restricting that youth from handling food for other youth until such time as the infection can be adequately treated to prevent contagion, or an adequate method of preventing contagion is identified and implemented.
