# Findings to Allow Teleconferenced Meetings Under California Government Code Section 54953(e)

- On September 16, 2021, the Governor signed AB 361, a bill that amends the Brown Act to allow local policy bodies to continue to meet by teleconferencing during a state of emergency....provided that the policy bodies make certain findings at least once every 30 days
- Most recent emergency order by the Mayor requires all bodies, except BOS and disciplinary hearings, to continue meeting virtually
- Subcommittee must make two findings (and vote) today on whether to continue remote meeting



# Teleconferencing Meetings Continued

Must make two findings:

1) That the DJJ Realignment Subcommittee has considered the circumstances of the state of emergency and 2) that one of the following circumstances exist:

(a) The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members to meet safely in person

**OR**

(b) State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing

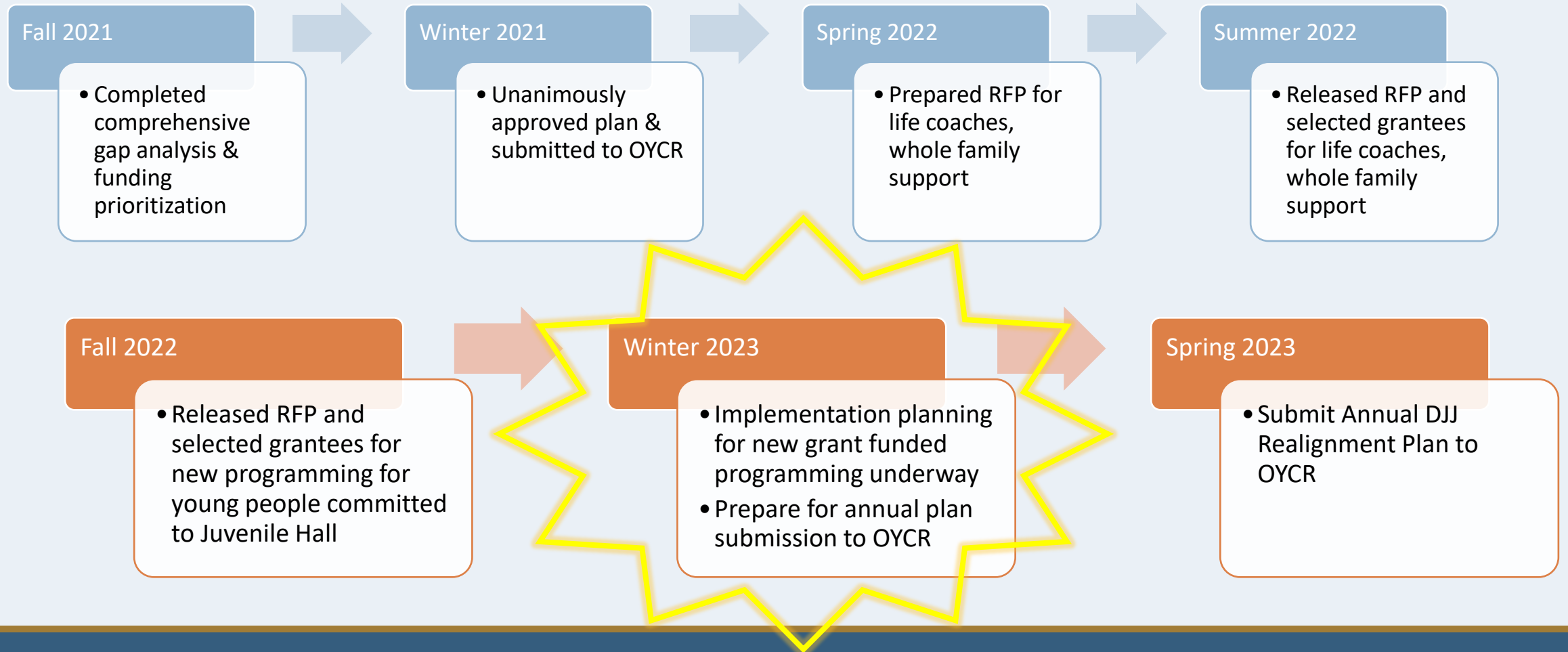

# DJJ Realignment Population

- Probation Caseload:
  - 28 youth have prior sustained 707(b) petitions (10% of total probation caseload, excluding AB12)
- Commitments:
  - SYTF: 7 young people committed to SYTF (1 currently housed in County Jail)
  - Base Term Range: 2-7 years.

# DJJ Realignment-Supported Grants: Life Coaches & Whole Family Support

- Credible Messenger Life Coaches grantees:
  - Success Centers – *in-custody*
  - Bay Area Community Resources (BACR) – *out of custody*
  - Renaissance Parents For Success/Us4Us – *out of custody*
- Flexible Funding for Youth & Their Families
  - Young Community Developers (YCD)
  - SF Pretrial Diversion Project
  - City Youth Now

# DJJ Realignment Plan

- Pursuant to [WIC 1995](#), “In order to continue receiving funding, the subcommittee shall convene to consider the plan every third year, but at a minimum submit the most recent plan regardless of changes. The plan shall be submitted to the Office of Youth and Community Restoration by May 1 of each year.”
- Plan to report accomplishments and progress towards implementation.
