The San Francisco Department of Public Health, Environmental Health Branch, Solid Waste Program, acting as the Local Enforcement Agency (LEA), is certified by the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to enforce state laws and regulations at solid waste sites within its jurisdiction. SFSWTRC operates under a Solid Waste Permit No. <u>38-AA-0001</u> issued by LEA. On February 6, 2020, LEA received an application for RFI amendment to the SWFP. The RFI, a document that describes the design and operation of a solid waste facility, is a required component of an application for a SWFP.

As required by Title 27, California Code of Regulations (27 CCR), <u>§ 21660.1</u>, LEA is distributing this notice for the purpose of noticing its acceptance of the amendment to the RFI for SFWTRC.

Project Description

The RFI amendment proposes to amend existing TPR to include the upgraded Integrated Materials Recovery Facility (iMRF) sorting line, the use of existing Ptarmigan equipment as a temporary backup sort line for interim periods of time as needed. This amendment also reflects the removals of OREX Press and Organic Annex, the updated descriptive languages on existing conditions of West Wing, associated scales, and San Francisco Public Works (SFPW) Loadout area. Changes made to TPR are detailed below:

- Facility Specifications and Plans Section has been revised to reflect current structures and activities within the transfer process facility. Section references site location map, identification of adjacent land uses and distances to residences or structures that are nearby and are within 1000 feet of the facility property line.
- 2. Schematic drawings and descriptive statements of manner have been updated for all features, processing areas, and activities to be conducted at the facility.
- 3. State Minimum Standards (SMS) section of the TPR has been updated to comply with each SMS contained in Title 14, California Code of Regulation <u>§§ 17406.1</u> through <u>17419.2</u>.

The RFI amendment does not propose any changes to the permitted operations, tonnage, traffic volume, hours of operation, and facility area boundaries.

LEA's Determination

LEA found that the proposed changes are: (1) consistent with all applicable certified and/or adopted CEQA documents, (2) consistent with State Minimum Standards, and (3) do not conflict with the terms and conditions in the current SWFP. Pursuant to 27 CCR $\frac{9}{21666}$, LEA determined that the application met the requirements of 27 CCR $\frac{9}{21665(c)}$ and accepted the application for filing on February 7, 2020.
