Advisory Committee Quorum Challenges

Requirement

JUSTIS Charter established 11 voting members for the Exec and Sub Committees, therefore requiring quorum of 6 voting members to be present per meeting

<u>Issue</u>

Approximately 50% of committee meetings since January 2021 did not have quorum, slowing our ability to provide consensus-based recommendations to the council for action

Options

- Encourage each voting agency to appoint a representative(s) to attend the advisory committees since
 quorum challenges have been presented, committee attendance has not increased
- 2. Reduce frequency of meetings reducing the current meeting cadence will continue to slow progress
 - Performance & Strategy every 6 weeks
- Data & Architecture every 4 weeks
- Systems & Large Projects every 6 weeks
- Operations & Maintenance every 2 weeks



Advisory Committee Quorum Challenges

Recommendation

3. Amend the bylaws to reduce advisory committees' voting memberships from 11 to 7 agencies that contribute data to JUSTIS – this change will only require 4 voting agencies to attain quorum

Under state and local law, a policy body cannot "transact business" – which means take any action other than adjourning the meeting or taking a recess, or taking action to secure a quorum – without a quorum of its members present. The JUSTIS committees are policy bodies because they were created by formal action of the JUSTIS Governance Council, in the bylaws, and the committees are subject to these quorum rules. Relevant sections from <u>Good Government Guide</u> p. 151:

A majority of the members of a policy body constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. Charter § 4.104(b); see generally Cal. Govt. Code § 54952.2(a); Admin. Code § 67.3(b) (defining "meeting" by reference to majority of members). For quorum purposes, "transaction of business" is an all-encompassing term that includes not only taking action on agenda items but also discussing them, receiving public comment, receiving staff reports, and conducting hearings, among other things. For quorum purposes, "majority" is measured by the number of members of the policy body designated by law, not the number of seats actually filled.

When a quorum fails to attend a meeting or the policy body loses a quorum at a meeting because of the departure of a member, the only official actions that the body may take are to (1) fix the time to which to adjourn, (2) adjourn the meeting, (3) recess the meeting, or (4) take measures to secure a quorum. See generally Cal. Govt. Code §§ 54955, 54955.1. Other actions that a body may take while it does not have a quorum are void.



Gartner Update

What can your agency do?

- Work with your vendors and insist they fully support integration with JUSTIS and your agency partners
- Recognizing applicable laws and regulations, question previous assumptions about data sharing and seek opportunities to share additional data that will contribute to improved outcomes
- Seek process changes that leverage data and technology as tools to complete the process rather than to just record what happened
- Formalize data governance to assure quality data is provided

Architecture and Data Sharing

The Committee's work is focused on progressing and completing data-related activities and deliverables approved by the executive council to develop the Data Center of Excellence.

FY 22-23 Accomplishments

- Agencies roles and responsibilities document
- Approved the FY22-23 and beyond committee workplan
- Created the data governance policy document
- Hired a DCOE Manager

FY23/24 Workplan

- 1. Define Data Governance (general operational plan)
- Develop Inter-Agency Data Strategy (DCOE, cost estimates, list of reports)
- 3. Build A Modern Data Infrastructure (integrations, data model, taxonomy and visualization)



Advisory Committee – Update

1. Define Data Governance

- Create General Operational Plan (Started)
 - Prepare a documented plan for governance of future data products and processes, written access control policy for data analysis, reports and dashboards.

2. Develop Inter-Agency Data Sharing Strategy

- Establish vision and role for Data Center of Excellence (DCOE) (Started)
 - Document the scope, services and SLAs, define resource plan
- Determine resources necessary for JUSTIS in 2023 and beyond including implementing DCOE (Started)
 - Developed high level capacity planning estimate, job description and cost estimates for FTEs
- Develop list of dashboards, predefined reports and other data products (Not started)
 - List of cross-agency reports, dashboards, and selective products document.

3. Build A Modern Data Infrastructure

- Standard Integrations for JUSTIS data sharing Design a re-usable and extensible API (started)
- Modernize JUSTIS data model -Build a conceptual data model (started)
- JUSTIS data taxonomy -Collect JUSTIS metadata, tool evaluation and selection (started)
- Provide a data visualization set –Use cases documents, user accounts, quick start guides (started)




Advisory Committee – Update

How will the committee accomplish these initiatives?

- Collaboration with other JUSTIS Advisory and Partners
 - Support cross-partner initiatives such as coordinating responses to prevent repeat offenses initiative
 - > Implement data standards that can be shared and or used by other City agencies
 - > Create and implement a structure for managing my common data language
 - > Standardize data structures to comply with internal and external governing bodies
 - Help agencies meet the FBI comprehensive incident-based reporting system (CIBRS) and customizing standards to create productive conversations about data and its governance
 - > Improve data transactions in JUSTIS and determine agency impacts
 - Define and establish the Data Center of Excellence (DCOE) operational framework

- 3. Explore the use and impact of custody holds and processes related to them, establishing cross-departmental protocols and new JUSTIS workflows

4. Expand knowledge about High User Analysis and make recommendations for well-being indicators.

Performance and Strategy - Chair Jason Cunningham

Crime & Case Type

Discussion has evolved to develop an initial taxonomy of terms to be handed off to Data &
 Architecture. Cross agency understanding of terms is key to minimizing confusion when conducting
 data analysis, to include crime/case count (goal 2) and others. (In progress)

Data Center of Excellence

- Work with Data & Architecture Advisory Committee to scope DCOE (In progress)
- Working with the DCOE on providing high level project guidance.
 - Likely will take shape as a recidivism dashboard in the same vein as the Justice Dashboard (goal 3) for interagency consumption.

Other issues

 Participating in the Consolidated Charge Table project. Will likely issue a recommended update policy for this group's approval in Q3.
