The mural is located on the retaining wall on Market St. at 19th St. in District 8. The mural measures 14 ft. at its highest point by 120 ft. wide. The restoration is funded by Special Project Grants and will not become part of the Civic Art Collection.
- 2. Motion to *Mr. S Leather*, a mural design by Serge Gay, Jr. The mural will be installed at Heron Street at 8th Street, in District 6. The mural measures approximately 20 ft. by 37 ft. The artwork is funded by MOHCD Cultural District and Private Funds and will not become part of the Civic Art Collection.
- Motion to approve The Excelsior Over Time, a mural design by Claudio Talavera-Ballón. The mural will be installed at four locations at 4840 Mission St. between Onondaga and Seneca in District 11. The mural measures approximately 852.25 sq. ft. The artwork is funded by MOHCD and will not become part of the Civic Art Collection.
- 4. Motion approve approve Sanctorum, a mural design by Mel Vera Cruz. The mural will be installed at 4th St. between Howard St. and Folsom St. in District 6. The mural will be installed on three walls, measuring approximately 10 ft by 20 ft., 15 ft. by 40 ft., and one stairway measuring approximately 20 ft. wide and 30 total steps. The artwork is funded by Caltrans Clean California and will not become part of the Civic Art Collection.

The mural measures approximately 55 ft by 10 ft. The artwork is funded by OEWD and a grant from SFMTA and will not become part of the Civic Art Collection.
- 7. Motion to approve *SFC415*, a mural design by Alex "Neckface" Montijo. The mural will be installed on 64 6th St. at Jessie St, in District 6. The mural measures approximately 10 ft by 60 ft. The artwork is funded by OEWD and a grant from SFMTA and will not become part of the Civic Art Collection.

Video Artwork Concept

Barakeh's stop-motion animation centers on San Francisco's relationship to the discourse of war via references spanning the Spanish conquests of the Americas, WWII military bases, and military technological innovation. The plot consists of two main scenes: an trip to the past from San Francisco to Alhambra to prevent the conquests of the Americas; and a trip to the future to California's deserts to prevent future wars shaped by the Bay Area's technological renaissance.

The first scene portrays fictional Queen Calafia—from Garci Rodriguez de Montalvo's 16th century novel *The Adventures of Esplendián*, and after whom California was named—traveling on a bridge to Alhambra, the Spanish seat of power, to fight an elite group of European colonial monarchs and conquistadors, whose portraits are sourced from works of arts and collections of local museums (de Young, Museum of Fine Arts). The first scene uses the bridge motif to symbolize the Bay Area's architectural, cultural, temporal, technological, and social justice bridging.

The second scene occurs in a desert landscape, referencing war technologies and weaponry fielded in Californian deserts. The action depicts hybrid characters from the first scene, conducting "human enhancement" and mutations on a large figure situated in the "predella" (Renaissance altarpiece) part of the composition to emphasize the rising importance of technology.
