President Collins began the meeting by reminding commissioners and the public that all public meetings will be returning to in-person; He also shared a few administrative upcoming deadlines regarding the annual Form 700 Statement of Economic Interest and set up their assigned emails to receive all communications that are SFAC-related business.

President Collins announced the hybrid meeting instructions.



The Commission Secretary Traka Lopez-White announced public comment instructions.

Followed by President Collins began the meeting by reading the Arts Commission's land acknowledgment statement.

## 2. Approval of the Minutes (10:12)

## 3. General Public Comment (15:38)



Amy Kaminer, the Development Director at the Litquake Foundation, inquired about an opportunity with SFAC to revise the organization's grant proposal application.

There was no additional public comment.

4. Directors Report (18:01)

Director Remington provided an overview of his activities and SFAC-related events from March through April. He started by recognizing April as California Arts, Culture, and Creativity Month, and SFAC will continue to amplify the arts throughout the city. Furthermore, on April 17th and 18th, the Arts and Culture Summit and advocacy day in Sacramento. Director Remington also recognized International Women's Day by honoring and highlighting SFAC commissioners and staff. Also, on March 15th, SFAC staff organized and held our first in-person committee meeting since March 2020. He acknowledges Commission Secretary Traka Lopez-White, Operations Associate Veronica Limcaco, Civic Art Collection Registrar Tara Peterson, Public Art Program Associate Craig Corpora, and all of our staff members who assisted in the in-person meetings. Finally, on March 16th, he presented a proclamation to artist Kehinde Wiley on behalf of Mayor London Breed at the Kehinde Wiley: An Archaeology of Silence opening reception at the de Young. A few other events that he attended were the opening reception for Kacy Jung: The Weight of Souls at the Jonathan Carver Moore Gallery, the American Indian Cultural District's town hall and third-anniversary celebration, and MoAD's Spring Fundraiser, Hat Matter: Thoughts of a Black Mad Hatter.



Director Remington also highlighted African American poet and civil rights activist Dr. Maya Angelou's 95th birthday on April 4th, along with a brief update on Dr. Maya Angelou's anticipated sculpture by artist Lava Thomas. During Director Remington's Community Investments Updates, he shared that the San Francisco Arts Storm Relief grant will support 44 San Francisco arts organizations and individual artists. As for gallery updates on March 24th, The San Francisco Public Library 2023 Artist in Residence RFQ closed and, in partnership with the Public Library, has publicized a Call for Curators to develop an exhibition that will showcase the impact and legacy of African-American actor, painter, muralist, printmaker, sculptor, and professional puppeteer, Ralph Alexander Chessé. Lastly on April 12th artists Arleene Correra Valencia and Georgina Reskala will converse about migration, materiality, and the power of memory in parallel with the Crossing Lines exhibition at the Main Gallery—also, an RFP seeking San Francisco arts organizations concentrating on teaching youth art photography classes. Applications are due April 14th.

In conjunction with public art updates, Director Remington, Civic Art Collection, and Public Art Program Director Mary Chou will moderate an artist's discussion panel session with Central Subway artists Leslie Shows, Amanda Hughen, and Yumei Hou at Art Market SF on April 22nd. The next day, the 110' sculpture, Node, by New York-based artist Roxy Pain will be installed at Yerba Buena Moscone Station.

During Director Remington's final report was HR updates, he announced new hires, which include Frank Ortiz (they/them) as a Program Associate for Community Investments and Grace Weiss as Project Manager for Civic Art Collection.

Commissioner Schnair recognized and commemorated staff for their hard work and tremendous efforts during the transition to conducting in-person hybrid meetings.

## **5. Committee Reports and Committee Matters**

1. Civic Design Review Committee

(31:05)

Unfortunately, Commissioner Carney was unable to present due to his absence. Instead, Commissioner Schnair presented the report with detailed illustrations and an overview of two final projects from the Civic Design Review committee meeting. The two projects are the Japantown Peace and Buchanan Street Mall. Commissioner Schnair mentioned the improvements made throughout each phase and the modernization that will allow these sites to become further accessible and provide additional resources for the San Francisco community.

Director Remington and President Collins further emphasized the significance and authority that the Civic Design Review committee has on developing the city's infrastructure and economic growth.

### 2. Visual Arts Committee

(40:37)

Commissioner Ferras presented the completed artwork, Serving the City, by Michael Bartalos at Fire Station 49 (the City's Ambulance Deployment Facility. Serving the City artworks communicates the Fire Department's mission "to protect the lives and property of the people of San Francisco." It represents the strength, courage, and continuous commitment to this work.

Next, commissioner Ferras showcased one of the Market Street poster series, the artwork titled Finding Filipino by Rina Ayuyang. The illustrations celebrate the history and contributions made by Filipinos in San Francisco.

In closing, Commissioner Ferras announced that African-American artist Kristine Mays was selected for the India Basin Shoreline Park Public Art Project. Kristine Mays received the highest score from the panelists. Mays' proposal titled Joy Personified, the life-sized artwork features seven life-size figural sculptures in three grouped installations—a couple dancing, boys running and playing, and girls playing double-dutch. This will be Mays' first permanent public art commission.
