Dear Members of the SF Animal Welfare and Control Commission,

The 2700 Sloat Boulevard housing project has morphed from 8 to 12 to 50 stories and the SF Zoo across the street could no longer be considered “an urban oasis” with the sounds and traffic of years of construction. Concerns are surprisingly not expressed in City and County of San Francisco Joint Zoo Committee Meeting approved minutes from January 2022 to June 2023. The website for Save Our Neighborhoods San Francisco --[www.sonsf.org](http://www.sonsf.org)-- neglects to specifically mention the likely negative impacts on the Zoo or its inhabitants -- [STOP 2700 SLOAT BLVD - Action Network](#). Lastly, a google search yields only a letter to the editor from March 11, 2022, with one relevant comment, in the Richmond Review -- [Letter to the Editor: A Few Reasons to Oppose 2700 Sloat Housing Project – Richmond Review/Sunset Beacon \(sfrichmondreview.com\)](#).

I am hoping that you will look into this issue and make a written recommendation to the Board of Appeals to deny this project as currently planned (there will be a hearing July 26<sup>th</sup>) and perhaps find out why, at least officially, there is silence from the SF Zoo.
