9	America's economy, and targeting our most vulnerable communities of color; and

11	WHEREAS, The U.S. Congress has an opportunity now to offer a pathway to
12	citizenship to our undocumented sisters and brothers by championing efforts to pass H.R.
13	1511 and S. 2606 [Renewing Immigration Provisions of the Immigration Act of 1929], also
14	known as the Registry Bill, which would update the registry date by which immigrants must
15	have arrived in the U.S. to be granted permanent residency, from the entry cutoff date of
16	January 1, 1972 to those who have lived here for at least seven years, granting over 8 million
17	workers immediate relief and a pathway to citizenship; and

19	WHEREAS, Congress has a historic opportunity to remove this systemic barrier and ensure immigrant workers and their families are not threatened by fear of deportation; and
