Meeting Instructions

- Members of the JUSTIS Executive Council will attend this meeting in-person. Members of the public are invited to observe the meeting in-person or remotely online as described above/below. Members of the public attending the meeting in person will have an opportunity to provide public comment on every item.
- In addition to in-person public comment, the JUSTIS Executive Council will hear up to 2 minutes of remote public comment on each agenda item. The JUSTIS Executive Council will hear remote public comment on each item in the order that commenters add themselves to the queue to comment on the item. Because of the 2-minute time limit, it is possible that not every person in the queue will have an opportunity to provide remote public comment. Remote public comment from people who have received an accommodation due to disability (as described below) will not count toward the 2-minute limit. General Public comment in-person will be available and for items to be Approved. Each speaker will be allowed 2 minutes to speak. Comments or opportunities to speak during the public comment period are shown on the agenda and call-in instructions are at the top of the agenda.
- City Hall, Room 201 is wheelchair accessible. Remote public participation is available upon request for individuals who cannot attend in person due to disability. Making a request to participate remotely no later than one (1) hour prior to the start of the meeting helps ensure availability of the meeting link.
