## ISSUE: ELIMINATION OF 72/80 FLEXIBLE SCHEDULE FOR NURSES AT SFVAMC, WORSENING STAFF CRISIS

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## WHAT'S THE ISSUE?

- Without consulting with frontline nurses, SFVA management announced the elimination of 72/80 flexible schedules for in-patient and emergency department nurses starting Nov 5th, as a 'cost-cutting measure'
- SFVA management has refused to negotiate over the decision or provide any budgetary data to justify the decision
- nurses believe this decision will lead to increased nurse burnout and a nurse staffing crisis that will negatively impact care for Veterans at SFVA and cost SFVA much more than it saves

## WHAT DO NURSES WANT?

- SFVA management to:
- reverse the decision to eliminate 72/80 schedules
- provide full transparency as to why and how the decision was made, what alternatives were considered, and what information and data was used to support the decision
