- 1.0 The meeting was called to order. Roll call found a quorum of committee members were present.
- 2.0 Approval of the minutes of the Code Advisory Committee regular meeting of October 11, 2023.
 - A motion was made to approve the minutes as written.
 - Seconded and approved.
- 3.0 Discussion and possible action regarding proposed ordinance amending the Existing Building Code to require buildings with 15 or more stories to conduct and submit supplemental inspection reports. (File No. 231130)

Possible action would be to make a recommendation to the Building Inspection Commission for their further action

Discussion:

- Structural Subcommittee had reviewed the proposed ordinance, and the proposed changes recommended by DBI.
- The intent is to incorporate all changes into the ordinance before the vote by the Board of Supervisors.
- There was a discussion on ASTM E2270 standard.
- City has a database of buildings over 15 stories, may be available to the public.
- Possible follow-up in February or March next year to ensure discussed changes are implemented.

Public Comment: No public comment.

Action:

- A motion was made to approve the proposed ordinance and proposed changes, with a recommendation to the Building Inspection Commission.
- The motion was seconded and approved.
- 4.0 Discussion and possible action regarding changes to Administrative Bulletin 093 Implementation of Green Building Regulations for using Form GS5 instead of Form GS2 for the new ADU units.

Possible action would be to make a recommendation to the Building Inspection Commission for their further action.

Discussion:

- Barry Hooper, Senior Green Built Environment Coordinator at the San Francisco Environment Department, delivered a presentation.
- Currently, free-standing ADUs face a higher standard compared to those within the building envelope.
- The proposed changes seek to treat all ADUs uniformly using the GS5 form.
- The city started allowing ADUs in 2014 to activate underutilized spaces.
- Free-standing ADUs are currently limited to small units, and the proposed changes aim to simplify the development process.
- Questions were raised about the number of free-standing ADUs built or under construction.
- There is a request for information regarding the majority of ADUs being within existing building envelopes.

Public Comment: No public comment.

Action:

- A motion was made to approve the proposed changes as written, with a recommendation to the Building Inspection Commission.
- The motion was seconded and approved.
- 5.0 Discussion and possible action regarding Information Sheet on "License Requirements for Electrical Permit Issuance and Installations.

Possible action would be to make a recommendation to the Department of Building Inspection for their further action.

Discussion:

- MEP & Fire Subcommittee discussed the Information Sheet and approved the proposed Information Sheet as written, with a recommendation to the CAC.
- Supervisor Connie Chan introduced legislation in July to codify the San Francisco electrical code regarding contractor license requirements for electrical installations.
- DBI found that the legislation, as written, wouldn't change procedures and might have preemption issues with the State.
- Collaborative effort with Supervisor Chan, DBI staff, City Attorney, and Chief Electrical Inspector Ken Burke to draft an information sheet.
- The Information Sheet clarifies permit issuance requirements under the San Francisco electrical code.
- Requirements include being a licensed contractor by the state and registered with DBI.
- The Information Sheet lists specialty contractor licenses (C10, C7, C46) required under the electrical code for safe installations and Includes an exception for general contractors performing unrelated trades.
- The homeowner exception and installation requirements have been addressed.
- The Information Sheet also aims to define roles and responsibilities in the growing low-voltage sector.
- Intended for dissemination among DBI staff, permit technicians, and field inspectors.
- There was a discussion regarding the complexity arising from new technologies, such as photon transmission for power.
