**Purpose:** The purpose of this policy is to ensure that long-acting injectable (LAI) antipsychotics are being appropriately administered within their ordered time frame. It is also meant to provide instruction on how to manage late administrations.

Scope: This policy applies to BHS nurses working in BHS clinics, including contract agencies. Nursing staff includes licensed vocational nurses (LVN), registered nurses (RN), and licensed psychiatric technicians (LPT).

## **Policy:**

If a client presents outside of ordered dosing frequency for their long-acting injectable antipsychotic, nurses should refer to Appendix 2: Missed LAI Dose Management in the BHS Safer Prescribing of Antipsychotics Guideline for how to proceed.
