<p>Protocol 5.09-Seizure in Pregnancy</p>	<p>Integrated with Adult Seizure Protocol 2.13</p>	
<p>Protocol 2.13 Adult Seizure</p>	<p><u>Jeremy Lacocque</u> – Move Eclampsia into own line. Mag should be given first before versed. If seizure longer than 5 mi, point to versed. Move mag to its own box and say "if suspected eclampsia, administer magnesium, even if seizure has resolved". Change med dose to 10 mg Versed – <u>Curtis Geier</u> agrees</p> <p><u>Melissa Rosenstein</u> – Not too important to get Mag quickly, so if field treats with benzos, its ok. If it is eclampsia, seizure will stop before mag is given. I think you give the benzo and not wait 5 minutes</p> <p><u>Janelle Cortright</u> - Change "Maintain quit." to "Maintain quiet, dim environment"</p> <p><u>Jeremy Lacocque</u> - Motion to approve</p> <p><u>Michael Mason</u> - second</p>	<p>Motion Passes</p>

Protocol 14.1 Magnesium Sulfate	<p><u>Jeremy Lacocque</u> - Under notes, it says " in third trimester", It should say "greater than 20 weeks gestational age". Include magnesium dosing for pediatric TdP, 50mg/kg</p> <p><u>Mary Mercer</u> - Motion to approve</p> <p><u>Clement Ye</u> - second</p>	Motion Passes
Protocol 7.18 TCP	<p><u>David Malmud</u> – Language not added to 1a</p> <p><u>Jeremy Lacocque</u> - Strike "or fentanyl (Pain)" since it's not included in the protocol for bradycardia and versed is favored, generally from #10 – <u>Clement Ye</u> agree</p> <p><u>Jesus Guerrero</u> - Motion to approve</p> <p><u>Michael Mason</u> - second</p>	Motion Passes
Protocol 2.07 Bradycardia	<p><u>David Malmud</u> - Lower white box on page one is missing an "L" in "calcium channe blocker"</p> <p><u>Jeremy Lacocque</u> - Motion: Add 12 lead to "no" arm.</p> <p>Under vagal bradycardia, have arrow pointing to left instead of bolus. Bolus won't fix brady + hypotension.</p> <p>Peaked t waves OR widening QRS.</p> <p>For bradycardia for suspected medication cause, follow protocol 2.10.</p> <p>Remove atropine comment from comments.</p> <p>Remove TCP for bradycardia unresponsive to medication</p> <p><u>Jesus Guerrero</u> - Motion to approve</p> <p><u>Michael Mason</u> - second</p>	Motion Passes
