San Francisco is at a pivotal moment.

With foot traffic down 31% from pre-pandemic levels, and over 54,000 residents permanently gone, the need for a compelling new vision to revitalize our urban

infrastructure is paramount — especially downtown.

I recently had the privilege of visiting Tokyo for the first time — and the city left me nothing short of starstruck with its urban design. Here are 10 ideas I saw that San Francisco can integrate into its city fabric to reinvigorate our ailing downtown.

Car-free streets



The walkability of Tokyo's car-free streets created a more thriving environment for small businesses and restaurants

Walking through Tokyo, one of the first things I marveled at was the abundance of car-free streets. This widespread flexibility to walk unencumbered by traffic was inspiring.

Moreover, Tokyo's walkability creates a thriving environment for small businesses and restaurants, as more foot traffic clearly leads to higher patronage. I didn't see a single corridor where residents weren't lining up for their favorite restaurant.

By prioritizing pedestrians, Tokyo also lowers air pollution. While San Francisco has about 460 cars per 1,000 people, Tokyo has 232. With this reduction in cars comes a commensurate reduction in traffic, congestion and pollution.

Double our sidewalk size

In the districts of Tokyo where cars are allowed, the sidewalks are massive; The pedestrian-to-car space ratio is easily 2 to 1.

The benefits of these larger sidewalks compound. More sidewalk space attracts more pedestrians. More pedestrians mean more foot traffic. And more foot traffic means more patronage for local businesses.

Large sidewalks also allow innovative use of space. Many in Tokyo have metal railings to protect pedestrians from cars. There are designated paths for both incoming and outgoing pedestrian traffic (you always walk on the left side in Tokyo). There's more room for public toilets. And there are vending machines serving water, ramen or even ice cream.

With more sidewalk, there's more room for people and the things that they need and enjoy.

Bikeable sidewalks

simpler, safer street designs, which could mean faster progress toward the Vision Zero goal of eliminating traffic fatalities here in San Francisco.

Cycling fatalities in Japan are around 2.3 per 100 million kilometers cycled, compared to 5.3 per 100 million kilometers cycled in the U.S. Not having to share the roads with cars leads to less risk of traffic fatalities.

Urban canopies

Greenery is everywhere in Tokyo.

Wider sidewalks allow the city to more easily integrate trees and canopies as a form of beautification. They make the city more walkable during summer heat waves.

Lest we forget, shade is good!

These trees also serve as carbon sinks. Considering that downtown San Francisco has the highest pollution and air quality rates in the city, more urban canopies can significantly help us meet our environmental goals.

Mixed-use districts

Part of the predicament of San Francisco's downtown has been its overreliance on workers from a single industry — tech — to patronize bars and restaurants and keep its nightlife afloat. Tokyo by contrast has significantly invested in mixed-use districts where residential, commercial, and small businesses coexist harmoniously.

Exploring the corridors in the financial center of Shibuya (think Times Square in New York) or the shopping center of Ginza (think Financial District in San

Francisco), one can find a mixture of housing, offices, businesses and cultural gems. In Ginza for instance, I could walk out of my hotel in the heart of downtown, stroll a mere 10 minutes, and discover a banana juice stand (aptly named Banana Juice) sandwiched between two skyscrapers and run by an elderly couple. It was also probably the best smoothie I have ever had.

When people can eat, work, and relax close to where they live, a city truly comes alive.

Markets between buildings

San Francisco is a small, dense city that some say is already too built out to allow new infrastructure.

Tokyo shows us how untrue that is. It is the city that leaves no stone unturned.

From food stalls in front of Tokyo's oldest temple (Sensoji, completed in A.D. 645), to fish markets and wagyu beef stands in Tsukiji, every possible inch of street space is a thriving urban corridor. And space, in this context, is both horizontal and vertical. Markets in Tokyo don't just spread across blocks, they go up, too. Some buildings have 10 stories of restaurants.

More space for commerce means more opportunities for small businesses, often started by immigrant families, to flourish and thrive.

We could start in San Francisco by converting all of Market Street — from Embarcadero to Civic Center — into one giant night market, filled with food stalls, vendors and tourist memorabilia.

Markets beneath underpasses

A market underneath a highway? Sounds unpleasant, but it doesn't have to be.

By far the most surprising market I discovered in Tokyo was underneath a busy underpass in Ginza. The walls were painted bright white with patches of exposed brick and modern sculptures. The shops ranged from casual yakitori bars to five-star omakase sushi restaurants. It was inspiring, but also somehow felt like a comfortable rest stop.

It makes total sense to better use these spaces. Underpasses largely sit vacant. Repurposing them as commercial corridors is straightforward.

Transit markets

Another striking feature of Tokyo's urban infrastructure is that every train station doubles as a shopping mall, with ramen corridors, anime gift shops, food markets, and dessert shops. And that's just on the lower levels. Upper levels often include

Such economic investment creates a symbiotic relationship between transit and local business. It's easy to envision something similar for Embarcadero station. Given its relatively safe public environment, it could succeed where Powell Station and the Westfield Mall failed.

Easy-to-navigate public transit

Speaking of transit, it's no mystery that Tokyo's public transit infrastructure is unparalleled. But what also impressed me was its attention to detail of the user experience as well.

Each subway stop is numbered sequentially, making it extremely easy to plan routes and estimate time to destination. Each exit in the train station is numbered

as well, making it even easier to navigate the station itself. The infrastructure is so optimized that Google recommendations can suggest specific train cars to board to make your transfers easier!

By implementing similar tweaks to our transit designs, we can transform the rider experience.

Rapid public transit

One key feature ensures Tokyo's unparalleled urban infrastructure functions smoothly — reliable and punctual public transit.

Say you want to go from the city center to a park. In Tokyo, the journey from Tokyo Station to Shinjuku National Garden — a distance of about 5 miles — would take 13 minutes. By contrast, getting from the Ferry Building to Golden Gate Park in San Francisco takes nearly 30 minutes.

The difference is Tokyo's investment in both infrastructure and staffing. With subway stops at nearly every block, trains arriving every two to three minutes, and a staff full of train operators to man them, you get a high-frequency transit system with service that arrives on time, down to the second. Without this level of efficiency, a city spanning nearly 1,000 square miles could not work as well as it does.

To unlock the full potential of San Francisco, we need to do the same.

Staring down the prospect of an economic doom loop, we have a narrow window of time to ensure this city remains home to those of us who love it. We can do this by

redefining our urban landscape and drawing inspiration from successful cities like Tokyo.

Two S.F. political rivals are doing something crazy: working together

Something unheard of is happening in the backstabbing world of San Francisco politics: Two former political rivals are working together on a bill making its way through the Legislature.

San Francisco Assembly Member Matt Haney is working with a guy he defeated in his Assembly race last year — entrepreneur and first-time candidate Bilal Mahmood — on a bill that could help bring jobs to San Francisco, unite the often warring tribes of labor, environmentalists and tech, and help the planet.

That kind of cooperation by the two San Francisco politicians “is incredibly rare,” said Panama Bartholomy, who worked with them on the legislation as executive

director of the Building Decarbonization Coalition and has worked in Sacramento politics for decades.

“The knife-fighting nature of San Francisco politics usually don’t lend themselves well to the types of egos that need to be healed after clashes during campaigns,” Bartholomy said.

The bill that is the fruit of their cooperation, [AB593](#), isn’t the sexiest piece of legislation moving through the Legislature, but it is important.

It would require the California Energy Commission to create an emission reduction strategy — with specified milestones — by next June for the state’s buildings and homes to achieve the state’s greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals. California’s 14 million homes and 7.5 million square feet of commercial structures produce about a quarter of the state’s greenhouse gasses, according to the commission.

Reducing building emissions would go a long way toward achieving California’s goal of being carbon neutral by 2045. Last year, Gov. Gavin Newsom announced a

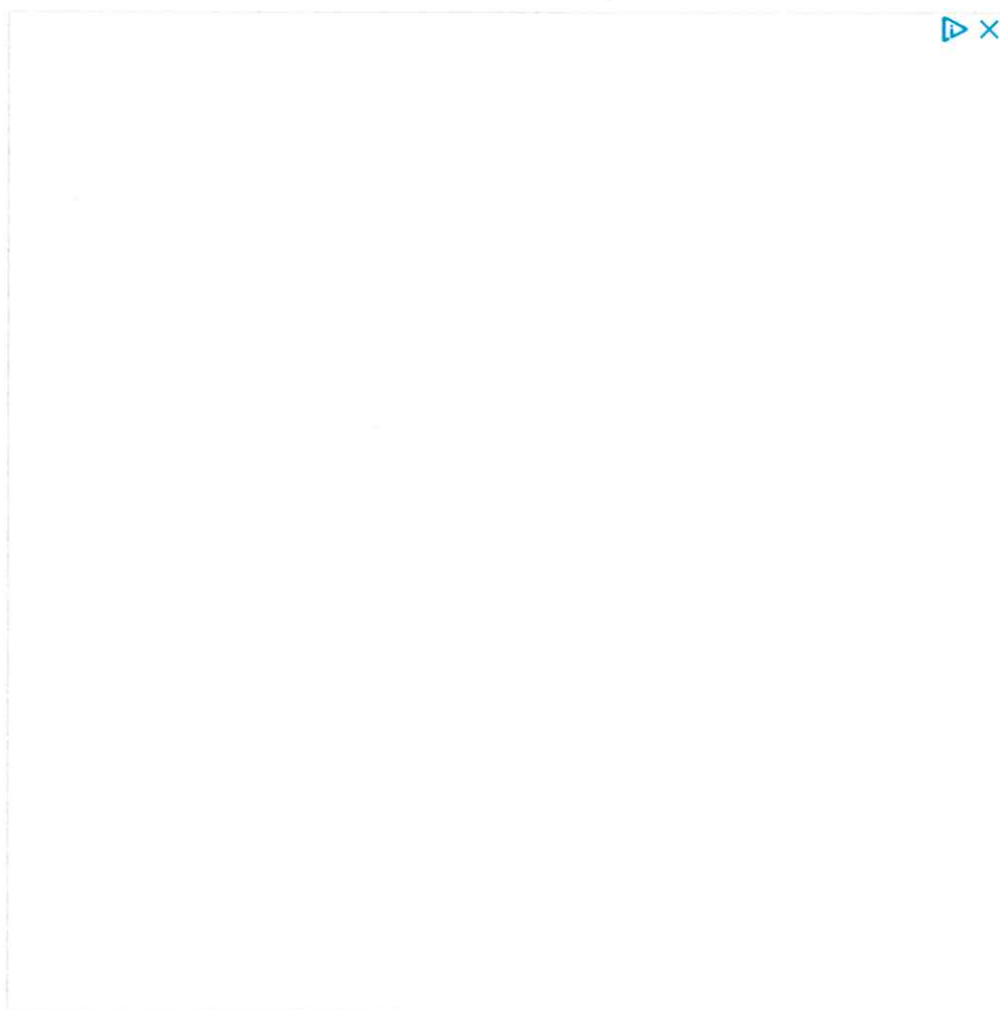
series of environmental goals, including creating 3 million “climate-friendly” homes by 2030 and 7 million by 2035. Newsom also proposed that the state build 6 million heat pumps — efficient, all-electric devices designed to replace a building’s furnace and air conditioner — by 2030.

But those were goals, Mahmood pointed out, not requirements.

“We don’t have any mandated plan from the government to actually set a plan on how to reduce those emissions,” Mahmood told me. “Actually, there’s no state in

the entire country that has a state-mandated plan, so this would be the first in the country.”

Having the state codify those targets and design incentives will help to create a market for electric home products, much like the state’s mandates helped spur the electric vehicle market. Last year, nearly 19% of all new cars sold in California were EVs, more than double the amount from two years earlier.

A standardized decarbonization plan could also help streamline the quilt of programs in place now. Bartholomy said California has “at least five agencies at the state level that give out rebates for building decarbonization or energy efficiency, as well as a sea of local administrators that do it. This would bring some order to all of that for everybody that wants to interact with the state.”

Requiring the state Energy Commission to create a roadmap for building decarbonization could help companies like Electric Air, a heat pump startup in San Francisco.

“Having some certainty around California’s plans — like incentives or regular regulatory framework — allows businesses to make plans,” said Electric Air founder Chris Mui. “It helps businesses make business decisions around questions like, ‘Is this a good spot for investment?’ whether it’s for heat pumps or for other electrification projects.”

Electric Air is the type of young company that Mahmood and Haney hope will take root in San Francisco.

The story of how the two got together started shortly after Haney defeated Mahmood and three other candidates in the February special primary for

California Assembly District 17. Mahmood, backed by an endorsement from YIMBY Action, one of the state's loudest advocates for building housing everywhere, finished with a surprising 22% of the vote in third place.

Shortly after the primary, the two shared dinner at Shalimar Restaurant, an Indian-Pakistani spot in the Tenderloin that is one of Mahmood's favorites. They talked about wanting to collaborate on issues in the future, particularly on climate, which had been a focus of Mahmood's campaign.

Mahmood didn't think much of it, not knowing whether such meetings between rivals after a heated campaign were typical. Maybe Haney just wanted his endorsement.

Haney said they began talking about building decarbonization, which was "new to me."

"We had gotten to know each other through the course of the campaign, but we didn't know each other," Haney said. "But I had become really impressed by his knowledge and expertise and commitment to climate change."

Soon after that meeting, Mahmood set up a tour — at Haney's request — of climate tech companies in the city. Mahmood did endorse Haney in the April runoff election last year against former San Francisco Supervisor David Campos. At Haney's victory party, the newly minted Assembly member told Mahmood again that he wanted to work with him on climate issues after getting to Sacramento.

"I didn't know if that's just something people say," Mahmood told me.

“The more I’ve learned is that like, no, they don’t always say that and they don’t follow through,” Mahmood said. “I really think it’s a testament to Haney that he follows through and honors his word.”

Haney said it’s so rare in San Francisco politics to work with an opponent after an election because “it’s hard for them to stop seeing each other as opponents and to build trust. And it took a little while for Bilal and I to do that. He was a little leery about it, and I didn’t know him that well. But here we are.”

He said the eventual bill “would not have happened if it wasn’t for us sitting down together and putting the election behind us and moving forward.” The two have become friends and regularly get coffee together.

But that sort of post-election connection, let alone friendship, is unusual. The widespread inability to work with one-time opponents is “why we don’t get things done,” Haney said. “All of these issues are much bigger than any one of us, let alone which one of us was lucky enough to come out on top in any individual election.”

Mahmood brought tech and climate knowledge and introduced the new state legislator to the climate tech community. Meanwhile, Haney schmoozed his friends in organized labor, which is often dubious about working with environmentalists on legislation that could put their members out of work.

But Haney assured labor that “this (bill) is one that doesn’t require us to put people out of work. This is not about shutting down any (industries) now but rather creating a whole new sector of work to reduce emissions in the residential and commercial buildings.”

Bartholomy said two former rivals were “a bit of an unlikely pairing. They don’t come from similar backgrounds. They don’t come from similar parts of San Francisco. I would like to hope that it can be a model for political collaborations in the city and can show that you can get really big things done if unlikely past rivals can work together.”

How likely does Bartholomy think similar collaborations can happen in cutthroat San Francisco in the future?

“Well,” Bartholomy said after a long pause, “if you work in climate change, you have to be an optimist.”

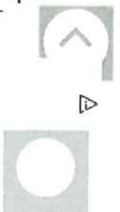
