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Re: Narcotics Arrests & Overdose Deaths—Apologies, Corrections & Interpretations

Dear Commissioners:

I wish here to amend my letter of August 21, 2024 and to apologize for my overly robust interpretation of the one year of overdose deaths and arrest data. I have spoken to a statistician who helped me analyze the data and herewith set forth those conclusions:

- 1. The sample size of 14 (technically "observations") is so small as to be almost meaningless. In short, we do not have enough to data to conclude anything.
- 2. In order to show a truly meaningful inverse relationship, one would need a correlation of at least -.95 and ideally -1.0. We do not have that here; therefore, no inverse correlation for dealers or users can be assumed.
 - 3. Neither the positive nor negative coefficients are meaningful.

In short, we cannot conclude anything from the data. Thanks to Commissioner Carter-Oberstone for nudging the process along. Again, I apologize to the Commissioners and take this as a lesson that, among other things, most of what I learned decades ago in my statistics class has been lost.
