BUSINESS DESCRIPTION

Teevan Company, also known as Teevan Restoration or Teevan, was established by James R. "Jim" Teevan in Burlingame in 1963 as Teevan Painting, Inc. Upon founding his business, Jim transcribed the guiding principles of his company on a piece of paper that he carried around in his wallet for the next 30 years. After several years of operating in the Peninsula and painting more than 1,000 homes while working towards his MBA, Jim Teevan registered the business in San Francisco in 1971. By 1978, Teevan officially moved to San Francisco and established an office at 1850 Washington Street in the Pacific Heights neighborhood.

Prior to the business' establishment in San Francisco, Teevan gained a loyal following of clients in the Peninsula. Jim Teevan responded to this success by broadening the company's services to include carpentry and restoration. Teevan's arrival in San Francisco coincided with the emergence of the historic preservation movement in response to the redevelopment of large areas of San Francisco during the 1960s and 1970s, resulting in the displacement of many communities and demolition of large swaths of historic buildings. This timing, along with Teevan's restoration skills, established the company as a significant contributor to the restoration industry.

Over the course of the company's existence, Teevan has painted, restored, and remodeled hundreds of properties in San Francisco and received local, regional, and national awards for their preservation of San Francisco's buildings. Some of their award-winning projects include the Soka Gakkai International Cultural Center in San Francisco, the Haas-Lillienthal House (2007 Franklin Street), and the S.H. Erlanger residence (270 Castenada Avenue). While Teevan has worked on many high-profile projects, most of their work is completed for clients that do not have a high income and are simply hoping to maintain their properties. Their business model relies on establishing long-term relationships with clients with long-term employees who work on many of their client's properties more than once.

James Teevan retired in 1999 and hired his successor Benjamin Lodomirak, who took ownership of the company with his wife Jesse Lodomirak in 2002. In 2004, Teevan Company moved to its current offices at 2247 Union Street in Cow Hollow. The piece of paper upon which Jim Teevan wrote the founding principles of his company hangs in the office as a reminder of Teevan's core values, traditions, commitment to its craft, and responsibility to honor the company, its clients, the city, and our history.

Further analysis of these properties will be completed as part of the Citywide Cultural Resources Survey.
- There have been a number of features and articles on Teevan's work in San Francisco in local media and national industry publications, including Remodeling Magazine, the San Francisco Chronicle, 7x7 Magazine, and Heritage News.

Section 4: Written Historical Narrative

CRITERION 1

a. Provide a short history of the business from the date the business opened in San Francisco to the present day, including the ownership history. For businesses with multiple locations, include the history of the original location in San Francisco (including whether it was the business's founding and or headquartered location) and the opening dates and locations of all other locations.

Teevan Company (AKA "Teevan Restoration" and "Teevan") was established in San Francisco in 1978 but founded 15 years earlier by James ("Jim") R. Teevan in Burlingame, just outside of the city of San Francisco. The business is presently located at 2247 Union Street in San Francisco's Cow Hollow neighborhood.

Jim Teevan founded what was then called Teevan Painting, Inc. in 1963 in Burlingame after graduating from Burlingame High School. He continued managing the company through four years at Yale and another two at the University of Southern California. MBA in hand and a clear set of values in mind, Jim focused on growing the business while giving other college students a chance to pay for their educations by working for Teevan.

Teevan registered for business in San Francisco in 1971. At the time its office was located at 1019 Rollins Road, Burlingame.

By 1976, Teevan had painted more than 1,000 homes on the Peninsula and gained a following of loyal clients who asked if Teevan could help with other home maintenance tasks. Jim responded by broadening the company's carpentry skills and learning the intricacies of waterproofing and restoration.

Teevan officially moved to San Francisco and established its office at 1840 Washington Street in Pacific Heights in 1978.

Over time, Teevan developed expertise in all areas of general contracting and remodeling. To better reflect its range of skills, Teevan Painting officially became Teevan Company in 1983. They have also done business as Teevan Restoration (approximately 1990-2010).

In 1999, Jim began to contemplate retirement and hired his ultimate successor, Benjamin Ladomirak. Ben and his wife, Jesse, assumed ownership of the company when Jim passed away in 2002.

In 2004, Teevan moved to its current offices at 2247 Union Street in Cow Hollow.

b. Describe any circumstances that required the business to cease operations in San Francisco for more than six months?

Not applicable. Teevan ceased most operations for a few months during the spring of 2020 due to the COVID-19 shelter-in-place order, but this time period was less than six months and Teevan continued to perform some essential services.

c. Is the business a family-owned business? If so, give the generational history of the business.

Yes, the business has always been family owned. It is currently owned by a married couple, Benjamin and Jesse Ladamirak. The Ladamiraks purchased the business from the original owner, Jim Teevan, in 2002.

d. Describe the ownership history when the business ownership is not the original owner or a family-owned business.

James Teevan founded Teevan Painting in 1963 and registered to do business in San Francisco in 1971. In 1999, Jim began hired his ultimate successor, Benjamin Ladamirak. Ben and his wife, Jesse, assumed ownership of the company when Jim passed away in 2002.

The ownership history of Teevan Company in San Francisco is as follows:

1971 to 2002: James R. Teevan
2002 to Present: Benjamin and Jesse Ladamirak

e. f. Note any other special features of the business location, such as, if the property associated with the business is listed on a local, state, or federal historic resources registry.

The historic resource status of the building at Teevan's current headquarters at 2247 Union Street is classified by the Planning Department as Category B, Unknown / Age Eligible, with regard to the California Environmental Quality Act. However, the building is a Queen Anne Victorian dating from the end of the 19th century. It was identified in the San Francisco Planning Department's 1976 Architectural Survey as an architecturally "significant" building and received a rating of "2" on a scale of negative 2 to 5. Its historic value and suitability for application of

the State Historical Building Code was confirmed by the City of San Francisco Planning Department staff in 2005.

CRITERION 2

a. Describe the business's contribution to the history and/or identity of the neighborhood, community or San Francisco.

San Francisco's buildings are integral to the city's history, identity, and character. By caring for those buildings, Teevan directly contributes to their preservation and survival in a tangible way. If we think of the city's architectural heritage as the star of a live stage show, then Teevan is like a loyal crew member, working behind the scenes to keep things running smoothly so the performers can shine.

Teevan Company has painted, restored, and remodeled hundreds of properties in San Francisco. The business has received local, regional, and national awards for historic preservation of San Francisco buildings. Some of the award-winning projects include:

- Soka Gakkai International Cultural Center in San Francisco, exterior restoration (2008 National Contractor of the Year Award, National Association of the Remodeling Industry (NARI).
- Haas-Lilienthal House (San Francisco Heritage), exterior restoration (named one of 34 National Treasures by National Trust for Historic Preservation, 2018 National Chrysalis Award, Contractor of the Year).
- A Painted Lady, exterior restoration (2009 NARI Remmie Award).
- Sacramento HOA, exterior restoration (2007 National Contractor of the Year Award, NARI).
- Noe Valley Victorian (c.1900), exterior restoration (2018 Regional Chrysalis Award).
- S. H. Erlanger residence, restoration and repair (2003 Award for Excellence in Architectural Preservation, San Francisco Heritage).

b. Is the business (or has been) associated with significant events in the neighborhood, the city, or the business industry?

James Teevan founded the business just as the city's historic preservation movement emerged in the 1960s and 70s, after the city's redevelopment policies had demolished entire neighborhoods and large swaths of Victorian architecture. This timing, combined with Jim's love for his city and its architecture, established Teevan as a significant contributor to historical restoration in the city.

c. Has the business ever been referenced in an historical context? Such as in a business trade publication, media, or historical documents?

Teevan's work and connection to the architectural history of San Francisco has been recognized in local media and national industry publications, including:

- Remodeling Magazine
- San Francisco Chronicle
- 7x7 Magazine
- Heritage News

d. Is the business associated with a significant or historical person?

James Teevan (1945-2002) was the founder of Teevan Painting, Inc. in 1963, which became Teevan Company in 1983. In 1999, Jim began to contemplate retirement and hired his ultimate successor, Ben Lodomirak.

e. How does the business demonstrate its commitment to the community?

In addition to caring for San Francisco's buildings, Teevan demonstrates its commitment to the community by continuing to locate its business here. There are thousands of painters and remodelers doing work in San Francisco, but relatively few with offices in the city. For years, Teevan watched others in the industry move out of San Francisco to reduce overhead expenses. Unlike retail, the building trades can work anywhere in the Bay Area regardless of where their offices are located.

When Jim died in 2002, his wife sold the Washington Street building that had housed Teevan since 1978. The company needed to relocate, and staying in San Francisco was becoming increasingly rare among contractors. But as brand-new owners of Teevan Company, Benjamin and Jesse Lodomirak never considered leaving the city. Jim lived, worked, built his business, and raised his children in San Francisco. He loved the city passionately, and this love is Teevan Company's history and legacy. It is the foundation of Teevan's identity. San Francisco is who Teevan Company is, and that means far more to the Lodomiraks than simply performing their work here, knowing the building codes, or being a recognized presence. It means locating themselves here, paying their taxes here, being easily accessible to their clients, and proudly embracing the city's efforts to care for its residents. Teevan Company ended up moving into a turn-of-the-century Queen Anne Victorian at 2247 Union Street, which suffered from decades of deferred maintenance. Thus, Teevan's first project was to restore its new home to its original splendor, including roof replacement, interior painting, woodwork repairs, and rehabbing and painting the entire façade.

For over 40 years, Teevan's business model has focused on creating long-term relationships with its clients and their homes and buildings. These relationships are the reason why Jim Teevan asked Ben and Jesse to take over his business. He wanted Teevan to continue after him to ensure that his clients and their homes would be taken care of. Almost 20 years since Jim's passing, Teevan Company still works for many of the same clients—oftentimes with the same employees performing the work!

f. Provide a description of the community the business serves.

Most of Teevan Company's work takes place outside the office – on and inside homes and buildings across San Francisco. For over 40 years, Teevan has painted, protected, repaired, maintained, restored, renovated, and rehabilitated thousands of buildings and homes in every neighborhood in the city. The business' community is San Francisco itself, and on any given day Teevan's signs and trucks with its signature homely stripes (Jim Teevan was, ironically, color blind) and its employees can be found from one end of the city to the other.

g. Is the business associated with a culturally significant building/structure/site/object/interior?

Since 2004, Teevan's offices have been located in a Queen Anne Victorian at 2247 Union Street built at the end of the 19th century. It was identified in the San Francisco Planning Department's 1976 Architectural Survey as an architecturally "significant" building. However, Teevan is not a prototypical legacy business in that most of its work occurs outside the office, on and inside homes and buildings across San Francisco, including many of its most celebrated historic landmarks (i.e. Haas-Lilienthal House).

h. How would the community be diminished if the business were to be sold, relocated, shut down, etc.?

Teevan's location in San Francisco is integral to the business. If the company moved out of the city, the essence of the business would inevitably change. Its clients could no longer stop to say 'hello' while shopping on Union Street; a homeowner with leaky windows could not pop in to ask for advice. Leaving the city would diminish its capacity to respond to the needs of the San Francisco community. Teevan does business in a profoundly different way than most companies in its industry. They do not chase big projects and fancy clients. Their business model relies on establishing long-term relationships with its clients and their homes and buildings.

Teevan has worked on some of the most historically and architecturally significant homes and buildings in San Francisco. Most of the work, however, is far less flashy. Many of Teevan's clients bought their houses and condominiums decades ago in a very different real estate market. They do not have a ton of money, but they want to spend it right and protect their most valuable assets. Frequently, they call Teevan for what amounts to a few hours or days of work—help find and fix a leak, perform minor repairs, repaint a room. Because of Teevan's Cow Hollow location, the business can respond quickly and efficiently to any request. No project is too small. Teevan Company is truly a neighborhood small business – the contractor on the corner who will run over at a moment's notice when your garage door jams. This is why Teevan's clients are so loyal and, in 2012, helped vote Teevan Company as San Francisco's favorite small business by 7x7 Readers.

To be sure, if Teevan Company moved out of San Francisco, the business would not be able to maintain the same level of intimate customer care that has always defined the business and made it unique in the industry.

CRITERION 3

a. Describe the business and the essential features that define its character.

Teevan Company is dedicated to maintaining and preserving San Francisco's physical features and the homes and buildings across the city. Services include painting and restoration, maintenance and repair, design and development, construction and remodeling, and leaks and waterproofing. Teevan's commitment to maintaining the city's identity is what defines the business. Teevan's headquarters embodies these physical features, traditions, and workmanship.

Building maintenance, repair, and renovation in San Francisco pose unique challenges, distinct from anywhere else in the Bay Area, including microclimates, seismic movement, water intrusion, historical and architectural sensitivities, geography, geology, building and population density, local codes and ordinances, etc. Teevan has spent the past five decades serving the city it loves. In so doing, Teevan has developed the experience, expertise, and institutional memory that make the business true San Francisco specialists.

Jim Teevan carried a certain folded piece of paper in his wallet for more than 30 years, on which he first typed the guiding principles of his new company. There are thousands of painters and remodelers doing work in San Francisco, but relatively few with offices located in the city. For years, contractors have left the city to reduce overhead.

In 2004, Teevan moved to its current offices on 2247 Union Street, a turn-of-the-century Queen Anne Victorian in Cow Hollow. The building had been neglected for decades, and Teevan's first project after moving in was to restore its original splendor. Teevan replaced the roof, performed interior painting and woodwork repairs, and rehabbed and painted the entire front façade.

The scaffolding came down from the exterior of the splendid Haas-Lilienthal House, a

129-year-old San Francisco Victorian, and there was a surprise underneath.

The mansion, a classic of the Queen Anne style, is no Painted Lady, like the ones beloved by tourists on Alamo Square.

Instead, the glistening new paint is a sedate olive green-gray color called “armored steel” with black window trim. There is not a trace of red or gold or silver. The house is a proper Victorian. It is not tarted up.

The new paint job for the old house was a bit of a surprise to some, including Fred Hamber, a banker who is one of the house’s many friends. He came back from a trip this week to find the house renewed. “I was expecting more color,” he said. “A bit of garish.”

Original color

Instead, the house was restored to the color it was painted when it was new in 1886. In those days, Victorian houses were solid and muted colors, gray or brown, or dark green. So when it came time for new paint, San Francisco Heritage, the nonprofit outfit that owns the house, did a lot of research.

“We didn’t choose the color, history chose it,” said Benjamin Lodomirak, a member of the Heritage board and the owner of Teevan Restoration, the contractor that did the job.

The last coat of paint was in a shade of dark gray. When the contractors stripped it down this summer they found 20 layers of paint and primer. The current paint job was completed this month.

Some years ago, the trust picked the Haas-Lilienthal House as one of 64 National Treasures in America. It is the only “national treasure” in San Francisco.

The big, three-story house at 2007 Franklin St., near Washington Street, was built for Bertha and William Haas, an immigrant German Jewish family. In an era of grand houses, it was a showpiece, with gables, a turret capped off with a tall “witches cap” that is the mark of the Queen Anne style.

Eventually several generations of the family grew up in the house. They were upper

middle-class, prominent members of the city's social and business elite, with family ties to the region's biggest business names, from Levi Strauss to Wells Fargo Bank.

The Haas and Lilienthal families became interconnected through marriage. The names of their descendants are all over the Bay Area, from the Haas School of Business at UC Berkeley to Levi's Stadium in Santa Clara. Over the generations, the families and their descendants gave away several fortunes to universities, parks and other institutions.

Showing its age

The last member of the family to live in the house was Alice Lilienthal Haas, and when she died in 1972, the house was left to San Francisco Heritage, which turned it into a museum. It is the only San Francisco Victorian open to the public.

Over time, the house began to show its age — and the Heritage mounted a \$4.3 million campaign to maintain the building. So far, \$3.3 million has been raised, said Alice Russell-Shapiro, a family member who is co-chair of the fundraising effort. That bought a major overhaul of the building, including repair of dry rot in the exterior and interior. The goal is to raise \$1 million more.

Why is a 129-year-old Victorian mansion important in the age of high tech?

“Because San Francisco is noted for innovation and the house is a reminder of the entrepreneurial spirit of the pioneer Jewish community,” said David Wessel, the other co-chair of the campaign, “and because it represents a spirit of giving back to the community.”

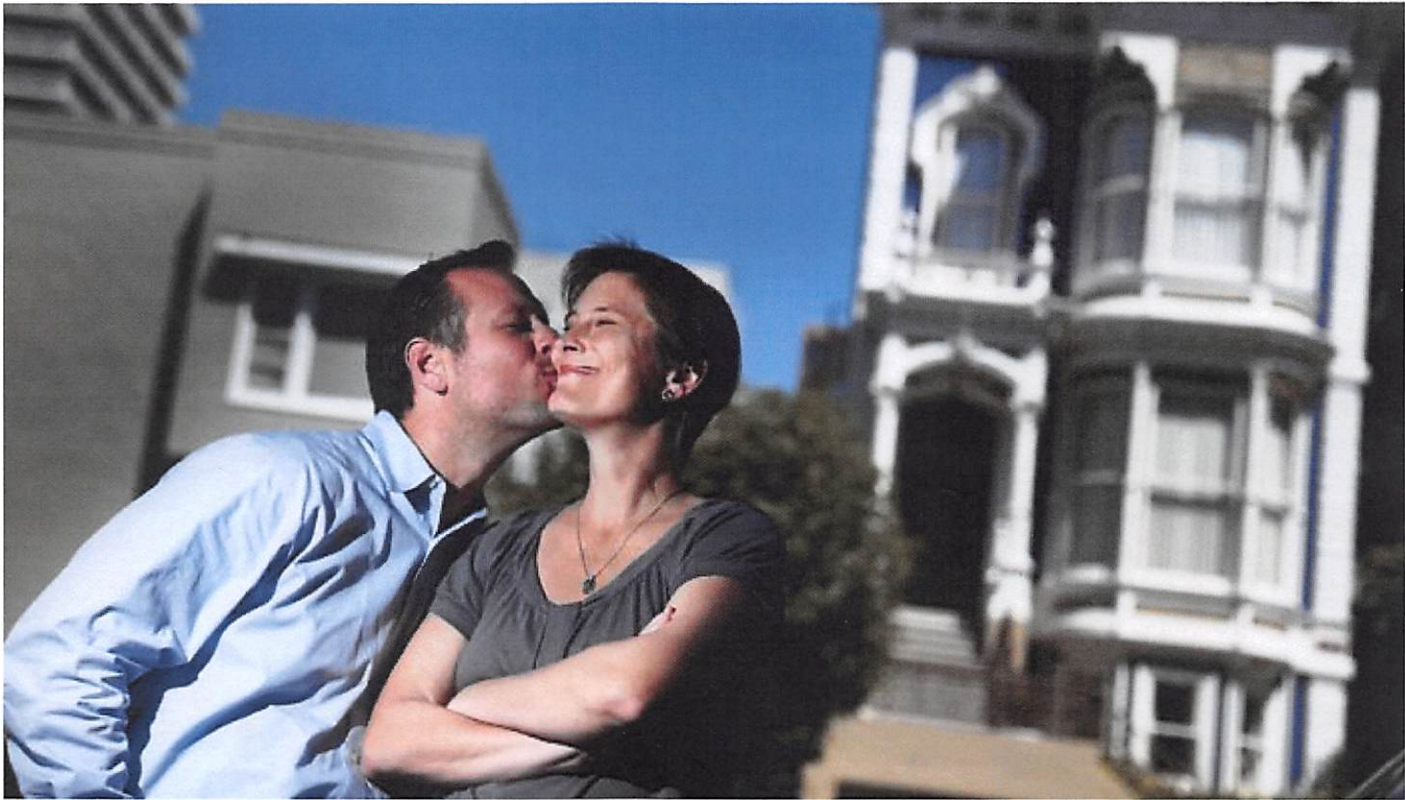

Old Victorians get restoration help

Ben Ladomirak lives on the Peninsula, but he works in a marvelous old house on Union Street in Cow Hollow. The house is one of a pair built for sisters at the end of the 19th century. The buildings are mirror images of each other: three stories, with curved windows, and full of those gingerbread touches beloved in the late Victorian era - leaded glass, cornices, bay windows, ornamental plaster, brick chimneys.

The big, old house is a San Francisco classic, perfect for the headquarters of Teevan Restoration, which is Ladomirak's company. Ladomirak and his associates - managers and craftsmen - are old-house doctors. They specialize in Victorians particularly, but others as well, and bringing them back to their former glory.

"Restoration is taking what's there and making it beautiful," Ladomirak said. "Remodeling is changing it."

Clinging to the past

A lot of San Franciscans don't like change, so they cling to the past, even in a center of high tech. The result is a city that prizes its thousands of Victorian houses, wooden reminders of another age. "They are part of the unique fabric of the city," Ladomirak said.

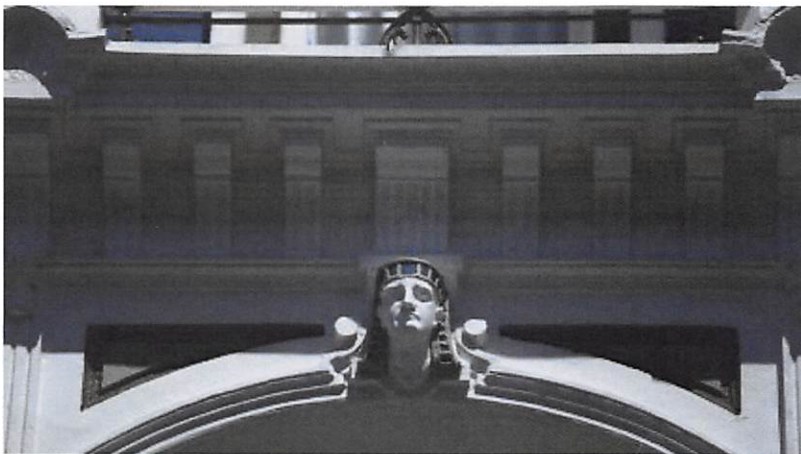
That wasn't always true. In the late 19th century, Ernest Peixotto, a highly regarded San Francisco artist, took a look at the city and hated the way it looked. He is quoted in the current issue of the historical journal *Argonaut* as calling houses of the famous Queen Anne and Eastlake styles "architectural monstrosities" and "nightmares of the architect's brain." The houses were "gabled, loaded with fantastic windows and hideous chimneys." That was in 1893, the high noon of Victorian San Francisco.

The fire and earthquake of 1906 destroyed at least half of San Francisco, and 50 years later, the Victorian survivors were again disdained.

Victorians were famous for being drafty, lacking central heating and being, well, old-fashioned. In the 1950s, contractors went door-to-door offering to remodel Victorians, and replace the elaborate woodwork with stucco or asbestos siding.

Whole areas of the Western Addition, occupied by African Americans mostly, were declared "blighted" and the old houses where they lived were bulldozed. "It was mayhem," said Bonnie Spindler, now president of the city's Victorian Alliance, established in 1974.

Gradually, the architectural pendulum swung the other way. The drab old gray and brown Victorians around the city were rehabilitated and emerged as "Painted Ladies," a term coined in 1978 by authors Elizabeth Pomada and Michael Larsen.

James Teevan ran one of the businesses that specialized in painting the old houses; it was said he had a passion for Victorians and that he knew the history of every old building in San Francisco. Gradually, his company, Teevan Painting, moved from painting into restoration. He sold the company to Ladamirak and his wife, Jesse, and died in 2002.

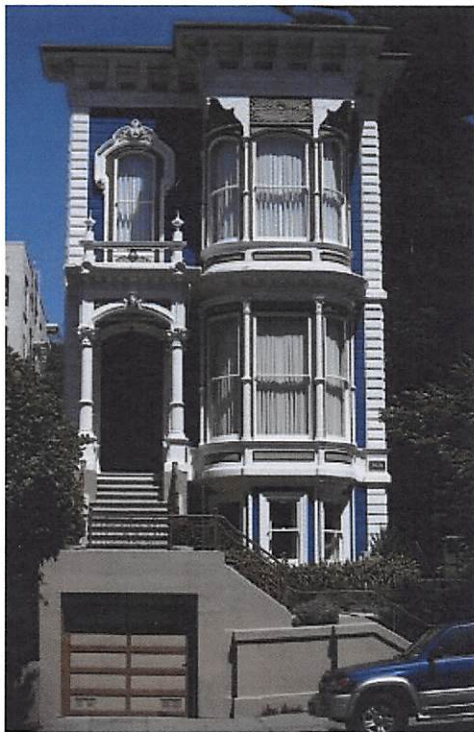
Teevan is narrowly focused now. "We went from a very large company to a very small one," Ladamirak said. The move was deliberate: Teevan is a big fish in a much smaller pond. "I wouldn't say we are thriving, but we are doing well."

Fabricating elements

It is a high-end business. Ladamirak likes to point to work his people did on the 1895 Edward Coleman house at the corner of Franklin and California streets. The house changed owners, and it needed restoration, especially on the exterior. Some of the details were made of horsehair and plaster. You can't buy that sort of thing at the hardware store, so Teevan's workers fabricated the pieces.

The house is a Queen Anne, white and gray with gold trim. Ladamirak is proud of the work. "Just look at that," he said.

The building has always been a classic and a showplace. And now it's worth a fortune: the Zillow real estate website values the Coleman house at \$5.966 million. Good taste does cost more.

Business Description

Teevan Company, also known as Teevan Restoration or Teevan, was established by James R. “Jim” Teevan in Burlingame in 1963 as Teevan Painting, Inc. Upon founding his business, Jim transcribed the guiding principles of his company on a piece of paper that he carried around in his wallet for the next 30 years. After several years of operating in the Peninsula and painting more than 1,000 homes while working towards his MBA, Jim Teevan registered the business in San Francisco in 1971. By 1978, Teevan officially moved to San Francisco and established an office at 1850 Washington Street in the Pacific Heights neighborhood

Prior to the business’ establishment in San Francisco, Teevan gained a loyal following of clients in the Peninsula. Jim Teevan responded to this success by broadening the company’s services to include carpentry and restoration. Teevan’s arrival in San Francisco coincided with the emergence of the historic preservation movement in response to the redevelopment of large areas of San Francisco during the 1960s and 1970s, resulting in the displacement of many communities and demolition of large swaths of historic buildings. This timing, along with Teevan’s restoration skills, established the company as a significant contributor to the restoration industry.

Over the course of the company's existence, Teevan has painted, restored, and remodeled hundreds of properties in San Francisco and received local, regional, and national awards for their preservation of San Francisco's buildings. Some of their award-winning projects include the Soka Gakkai International Cultural Center in San Francisco, the Haas-Lillienthal House (2007 Franklin Street), and the S.H. Erlanger residence (270 Castenada Avenue). While Teevan has worked on many high-profile projects, most of their work is completed for clients that do not have a high income and are simply hoping to maintain their properties. Their business model relies on establishing long-term relationships with clients with long-term employees who work on many of their client's properties more than once.

James Teevan retired in 1999 and hired his successor Benjamin Ladamirak, who took ownership of the company with his wife Jesse Ladamirak in 2002. In 2004, Teevan Company moved to its current offices at 2247 Union Street in Cow Hollow. The piece of paper upon which Jim Teevan wrote the founding principles of his company hangs in the Ladamirak's office as a reminder of Teevan's core values, traditions, commitment to its craft, and responsibility to honor the company, its clients, the city, and our history. The business's primary location at 2247 Union Street is a Category B (Unknown/Age Eligible) structure on the south side of Union Street between Steiner and Fillmore streets in the Marina neighborhood. It is within the Union Street NCD (Neighborhood Commercial) Zoning District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.

Staff Analysis

Review Criteria

1. *When was business founded?*

The business was founded in 1978 in San Francisco but was founded previously in Burlingame in 1963.

2. *Does the business qualify for listing on the Legacy Business Registry? If so, how?*

Yes. Teevan Company qualifies for listing on the Legacy Business Registry because it meets all of the eligibility Criteria:

- a. Teevan Company has operated continuously in San Francisco for 43 years.
- b. Teevan Company has contributed to the history and identity of the Marina neighborhood and San Francisco.
- c. Teevan Company is committed to maintaining the physical features and traditions that define the organization.

3. *Is the business associated with a culturally significant art/craft/cuisine/tradition?*

Yes. The business is associated with the practice of preserving historic buildings in San Francisco.

4. *Is the business or its building associated with significant events, persons, and/or architecture?*

No.

5. *Is the property associated with the business listed on a local, state, or federal historic resource registry?*

No.

6. *Is the business mentioned in a local historic context statement?*

Yes. The property is identified for further research and follow up as part of a discontinuous cluster of mixed-use commercial buildings on Union Street in the *Draft Neighborhood Commercial Buildings Historic Context Statement and Survey 1865-1965*. Further analysis of these properties will be completed as part of the Citywide Cultural Resources Survey.

7. *Has the business been cited in published literature, newspapers, journals, etc.?*

Yes. There have been a number of features and articles on Teevan's work in San Francisco in local media and national industry publications, including *Remodeling Magazine*, the *San Francisco Chronicle*, *7x7 Magazine*, and *Heritage News*.
