Refuse Rate Goal: Enhance the Cleanliness of San Francisco

Continue Key City Initiatives

- Outreach and Enforcement (OnE) Team
- Litter Patrol neighborhood trash pickup in the public right of way
- Monthly trash can steam cleaning
- Courtesy bulky item pickup (residential)
- Removal of reported illegal dumping on sidewalks and roads
- Proactive illegal dumping abatement operation (Bayview hot spots)
- Mechanical street sweeping to remove leaves and litter from the curb lane.

Trash cans

- Service and maintain existing trash cans in the public right of way
- Continue new trash can procurement process


Refuse Rate Funding for Public Works – Labor (\$12.7M)

Outreach and Enforcement (OnE) Team

- o 10.0 FTE
- Started in 2013
- o The team is responsible for
 - educating merchants, property owners and residents of their rights and responsibilities regarding street and sidewalk cleanliness and enforcing City codes to ensure sanitation standards are met.

Additional Staff


- o 31.0 FTE
 - 1824 Trash Can Manager
 - 7514 General Laborers
 - 7355 Truck Drivers
- Responsible for Litter Patrol and block sweepers




OnE Team Activity – By Type






OnE Team Outreach Efforts – Activity by Type / Zone





Total Tons of Debris Collected by Fiscal Year






Refuse Rate Funding for Public Works – Non-Labor (\$1.8M)

Trash Can Steam Cleaning

- Started with 2017 rate process
- \$1.7M in funding for routine cleaning trash cans citywide
- Provided by Community Youth Center of San Francisco (CYC)
- Services include:
 - Pressure washing of trash cans and surrounding area
 - Litter removal in areas surrounding trash cans
 - Notifying Public Works of graffiti and malfunctioning and damaged trash cans

Trashcan Program

- o 3,300 trash cans citywide
- Funding for maintenance of existing trash cans
- Funding to begin process of replacing existing trash cans
- Analysis of trash cans







Refuse Rate Process

- Clarify Service and Memorialize Expectations to Improve Cleanliness
 - Adjust frequency of trash can service, if needed
 - Track and monitor performance to ensure goal is being met
 - Assure trash can maintenance and repairs are timely and sufficient
- Deployment of City Trash Cans
 - Formalize process for deployment modifications
- Abandoned Materials
 - Explore increased afternoon services
- Self-Haul
 - o Tighten language
