- Commissioner Tobin reported on the progress of the animal welfare report, which will be reviewed by the Animal Commission in October and shared with the Joint Zoo/Rec and Park Committee as well. It will be presented at the November Joint Zoo/Rec and Park meeting.
- Vice Chair Ozernoy asked about the updates regarding the Animal Commission's horseback riding letter sent to the Board of Supervisors. Chair Torres noted some encouraging news about the City working on the issues and that the contract would not happen until 2025.
- Chair Torres responded to how the November ballot measures may impact the Animal Commission. Depending upon which ballot is approved, commissions will be subject to review for redundancies or potential reforms.
