 Released RFP and selected grantees for new programming for young people committed to Juvenile Hall

Winter 2022

- Planned for new grant funded program implementation
- Prepared for annual plan submission to OYCR

Spring 2023

 Submitted Annual DJJ Realignment Plan to OYCR

Summer 2023

- Implementing programs (credible messenger life coaches, flex funding for families, & in-custody programming)
- DCYF RFP Released
- RFP incorporates DJJ Realignment Subcommittee vision into 5-year grant cycle

- DCYF Awards Announced

Fall 2023

- Initiate reentry planning efforts
- Continue implementation of programming, including the establishment of Secure **Commitment Providers Advisory Board**

Winter 2023/24

- Implement physical improvements to the facility, as recommended by and reflected through DJJ Realignment planning process
- Continued reentry planning efforts
- Secure Commitment Provider Advisory Board meeting regularly

Fall/Winter 2024

- DCYF grants awarded, implementing programs
- Reentry Planning Workgroup has completed their work and will present to the subcommittee at December meeting
- Will issue Reentry Services RFP
- Ongoing physical and programmatic improvements to SYTF


San Francisco DJJ Realignment Population

- Probation Caseload:
 - About 18% of total probation caseload have prior sustained 707(b) petitions, excluding AB12
- Commitments:
 - Secure Youth Treatment Facility (SYTF): 6 young people currently committed to SYTF, 1 young person committed to Juvenile Hall
 - Base Term Range: 2-7 years
 - Since operating an SYTF, SF has discharged one young person who completed his commitment term to probation and has stepped down four young people to less restrictive placements

Facility Updates

- New furniture ordered for SYTF Units: dining and living areas as well as sleeping rooms
 - Young people chose the items for their sleeping rooms (desks, bookshelves, nightstands)
- Rugs are now in all occupied SYTF unit sleeping rooms
 - Rugs chosen by young people









Facility Updates

Programmatic Updates

- City College of San Francisco
 - Offers 2 classes per semester, in person, to young people committed to JJC
 - Both HS graduates and dual enrollment for committed HS students
 - Currently offering From Funk to Hip Hop and Interpersonal Communication both which satisfy foundational AA/BA transfer classes

Programmatic Updates

- Housing Support & Services RFPs and New Contractors
 - 3rd Street Youth Center & Clinic and Scholastic Interest Group are currently supporting youth who have been stepped down
 - Covers rent & utilities
 - All new furniture and necessities for new apartment
 - Cell phone
 - Monthly payment for financial support
 - Sharp Circle funded to offer support through the same mechanism as Scholastic Interest Group
